
SUBJECT: Fiscal Note for HB 2190 by House Committee on Federal and State Affairs

In accordance with KSA 75-3715a, the following fiscal note concerning HB 2190 is respectfully submitted to your committee.

Under current law, it is unlawful to possess a firearm on the grounds of specified state and local properties. HB 2190 would delete “on the grounds in any of the following places,” clarifying that the prohibition on firearms is limited to inside the buildings listed in that section. The exception is the Governor’s residence, which still includes the grounds as a location where firearms are prohibited.

HB 2190 would have no fiscal effect.
