SUBJECT: Fiscal Note for HB 2550 by House Committee on Agriculture and Natural Resources


In accordance with KSA 75-3715a, the following fiscal note concerning HB 2550 is respectfully submitted to your committee.

HB 2550 would repeal the requirement that the Kansas Department of Health and Environment (KDHE) establish and maintain six wet deposition mercury monitors.

The passage of HB 2550 would reduce expenditures and fee revenue by \$20,000 in FY 2015. The Department would retire at least one monitor, and the reduction in fee revenue would be offset by a corresponding reduction in expenditures for sampling and analysis related to the monitor.
