SUBJECT: Fiscal Note for SB 370 by Senate Committee on Ways and Means

In accordance with KSA 75-3715a, the following fiscal note concerning SB 370 is respectfully submitted to your committee.

SB 370 would give the Kansas Department of Wildlife, Parks and Tourism authority to purchase approximately 484 acres in Pottawatomie County. The land would be used as a public wildlife area.

According to the Kansas Department of Wildlife, Parks and Tourism, the contracted price for the land that would be purchased upon passage of SB 370 is \$768,000. Twenty-five percent of the amount would come from the state Wildlife Fee Fund and 75.0 percent would come from the federal Wildlife Restoration Fund. While the agency indicates that passage of the bill might increase the number of hunting licenses sold each year with the state, it is unable to estimate the revenue that might result from those sales. Any fiscal effect associated with SB 370 is not reflected in *The FY 2015 Governor's Budget Report*.
