SUBJECT: Fiscal Note for SB 421 by Senate Committee on Ways and Means


In accordance with KSA 75-3715a, the following fiscal note concerning SB 421 is respectfully submitted to your committee.

SB 421 would permit the Department of Corrections to publish program credits earned by inmates on the agency's public website. Inmates must consent to the publishing of the credits.

The Department of Corrections indicates that SB 421 would require approximately \$7,000 for FY 2015 for information technology programming costs to display the credits on the Kansas Adult Supervised Population Electronic Repository system and to modify the offender management system to create an electronic means for inmates to provide consent. It is estimated that the additional expenditures could be absorbed within existing resources. Any fiscal effect associated with SB 421 is not reflected in *The FY 2015 Governor's Budget Report*.
