Chairwomen Tyson and members of the committee:

Thank you for the opportunity to testify in support of Senate Concurrent Resolution 1604.

As owner of Hometown Market in Bird City, Kansas, I feel lowering sales tax on food is important in that neighboring states such as Nebraska, Colorado, Missouri and Oklahoma have 0-4.5% sales tax as we are 6.5%. I being near Nebraska and Colorado deal with the 0%.

As stated, 6.5% plus county and city tax making Cheyenne County at 8.5% , I experience many conversations of customers telling me of shopping in neighboring states to avoid sales tax on food items. As a small business owner, it is tough enough to survive in a town of 500 or less, let alone hear of shopping out of town and State.

If we did not have tax on food, and people stay in state (Kansas) it would help raise small business revenue.

I am a proud small business owner and take pride in my grocery store. Some services I provide are as follows:

It is time to help Kansas Citizens to be proud to say "I SHOP AT HOME" thanks to NO tax on food items.

In 2014 America's Health Rankings for the State of Kansas dropped from 8th to 27th.

I supply fresh produce, (some organic), fresh meat and a willingness to search for needs of my customers. Hoping they shop at home. No tax could help them buy due to savings!!

Kansas also spent \$1.6 billion on Obesity related expenditures in 2009.
