**SUBJECT:** Fiscal Note for HB 2164 by House Committee on Education

In accordance with KSA 75-3715a, the following fiscal note concerning HB 2164 is respectfully submitted to your committee.

HB 2164 would amend current law to provide an additional board member to the Cowley County Community College Board of Trustees, who would be elected exclusively from Sumner County. The election would occur in the fall of odd-numbered years in conjunction with city and school general elections. The bill clarifies that membership would include the additional member so long as Sumner County provides financial support for the benefit of the College in the form of a countywide retailers' sales tax or an ad valorem property tax levied on all taxable tangible property located in Sumner County.

The Kansas Association of Counties indicates the cost to add another question to the ballot in Sumner County under the provisions of HB 2164 would be negligible and could be absorbed within existing resources. The Office of the Secretary of State adds that a primary election may be needed depending on the number of candidates filing for office, but the cost to the Sumner County Election Office would be negligible.
