

## HOUSE BILL No. 2029

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1 AN ACT concerning public health; relating to cannabidiol investigational  
2 products; regulation.

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4 *Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Kansas:*

5 Section 1. (a) As used in this section, unless the context requires  
6 otherwise:

7 (1) "Cannabidiol" or "cbd" means a compound derived from the  
8 cannabis plant that is devoid of psychoactive activity.

9 (2) "Department" means the department of health and environment.

10 (3) "Investigational product" means a pharmaceutical form of an  
11 active ingredient or placebo being tested or used as a reference in a clinical  
12 trial, including a product with a marketing authorization when used in a  
13 way different from the approved form, or when used for an unapproved  
14 indication, or when used to gain further information about an approved  
15 use.

16 (b) If a cannabidiol investigational product that is newly approved as  
17 a prescription medication pursuant to 21 U.S.C. § 360bb and 21 U.S.C. §  
18 355 is controlled or decontrolled under a federal interim final rule issued  
19 pursuant to 21 U.S.C. § 811(j), then similar control or decontrol of the  
20 cannabidiol investigational product under the uniform controlled  
21 substances act shall be immediately effective upon the date of publication  
22 in the federal register of the interim final rule.

23 (c) When a federal final rule is issued pursuant to 21 U.S.C. § 811(j),  
24 after interested persons had an opportunity to comment on a federal final  
25 interim rule, changes necessary to conform the control or decontrol of a  
26 cannabidiol investigational product under subsection (b) shall be  
27 immediately effective upon the date of publication in the federal register of  
28 the federal final rule.

29 (d) Control or decontrol under the uniform controlled substances act  
30 in conformance with federal law may be altered by state statute or an  
31 emergency or temporary rule or regulation issued by the department to  
32 address an immediate danger to public health, safety or welfare.

33 Sec. 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its  
34 publication in the statute book.
