AN ACT concerning the client assessment, referral and evaluation 1 2 program; relating to powers, duties and functions of the secretary for 3 aging and disability services; authority to contract for a period of time; 4 amending K.S.A. 2017 Supp. 39-968 and repealing the existing section. 5 6 Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Kansas: 7 K.S.A. 2017 Supp. 39-968 is hereby amended to read as Section 1. 8 follows: 39-968. (a) To achieve a quality of life for Kansans with long-9 term care needs in an environment of choice that maximizes independent 10 living capabilities and recognizes diversity, this act establishes a program 11 which that is intended to encourage a wide array of quality, cost-effective 12 and affordable long-term care choices. This program shall be known as 13 client assessment, referral and evaluation (CARE). The purposes of the CARE-is for program are data collection-and, individual assessment-and, 14 referral to community-based services and appropriate placement in long-15 16 term care facilities. 17 (b) As used in this section: "Assessment services" means evaluation of an individual's health 18 (1)19 and functional status to determine the need for long-term care services and 20 to identify appropriate service options-which that meet these needs 21 utilizing the elient assessment, referral and evaluation (CARE) form. 22 "Healthcare data governing board" means the board abolished by (2)23 K.S.A. 65-6803, and amendments thereto. 24 "Medical care facility" shall have the meaning ascribed to such term under means the same as defined in K.S.A. 65-425, and amendments 25 26 thereto. 27 "Nursing facility"-shall have the meaning ascribed to such term-(4) 28 under means the same as defined in K.S.A. 39-923, and amendments 29 thereto. 30 "Secretary" means the secretary for aging and disability services. (5) 31 There is hereby established the client assessment, referral and (c) 32 evaluation (CARE) program. The CARE program shall be administered by 33 the secretary for aging and disability services and shall be implemented on 34 a phased-in basis in accordance with the provisions of this section. 35 All rules and regulations adopted by the healthcare data (d)36 governing board relating to elient assessment, referral and evaluation (the

1 CARE) data entry form shall be deemed to be the rules and regulations of 2 the Kansas department of health and environment until revised, revoked or 3 nullified pursuant to law. The purpose of this form is for data collection

4 and referral services. Such form shall be concise and questions shall be 5 limited to those necessary to carry out the stated purposes. The elient-6 assessment, referral and evaluation (CARE) data entry form shall include, 7 but not be limited to, the preadmission screening and annual resident 8 review (PASARR) questions. The secretary for aging and disability services shall approve the elient assessment, referral and evaluation-9 (CARE) data entry form. The elient assessment, referral and evaluation 10 (CARE) data entry form shall be used by all persons providing assessment 11 12 services

13 (e) (1) Each individual prior to admission to a nursing facility as a resident of the facility shall receive assessment services to be provided by 14 area agencies on aging contracted by the secretary for aging and 15 16 disability services or, on and after January 1, 2020, by the secretary for aging and disability services, with the assistance of area agencies on aging, 17 except: (A) Such assessment services shall be provided by a medical care 18 19 facility to a patient of the medical care facility who is considering 20 becoming a resident of a nursing facility upon discharge from the medical 21 care facility; and (B) on and after January 1, 2020, as authorized by rules 22 and regulations adopted by the secretary for aging and disability services 23 pursuant to subsection (i).

(2) The provisions of this subsection shall not apply to any individual
 exempted from preadmission screening and annual resident review under
 42 C.F.R. 483.106.

(f) The secretary for aging and disability services shall cooperate with
 the area agencies on aging providing assessment services under this
 section.

(g) The secretary for aging and disability services shall assure that each area agency on aging shall compile comprehensive resource information for use by individuals and agencies related to long-term care resources including all area offices of the Kansas department for children and families and local health departments. This information shall include, but not be limited to, resources available to assist persons to choose alternatives to institutional care.

(h) Nursing facilities and medical care facilities shall make available
information referenced in subsection (g) to each person seeking admission
or upon discharge as appropriate. Any person licensed to practice the
healing arts as defined in K.S.A. 65-2802, and amendments thereto, shall
make the same resource information available to any person identified as
seeking or needing long-term care. Each senior center and each area
agency on aging shall make available such information.

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(i) The secretary shall adopt rules and regulations to govern such matters as the secretary deems necessary for the administration of this act.

3 (i) (1) There is hereby established an eleven-member voluntary 4 oversight council-which that shall meet monthly for the purpose of 5 assisting the secretary for aging and disability services in restructuring the 6 assessment and referral program in a manner consistent with this act and 7 shall meet quarterly thereafter for the purpose of monitoring and advising 8 the secretary regarding the CARE program. The council shall be advisory 9 only, except that the secretary for aging and disability services shall file 10 with the council each six months the secretary's response to council 11 comments or recommendations

12 (2) The secretary for aging and disability services shall appoint two representatives of hospitals, two representatives of nursing facilities, two 13 consumers and two representatives of providers of home and community-14 based services. The secretary of health and environment and the secretary 15 16 for children and families, or their designees, shall be members of the 17 council in addition to the eight appointed members. The secretary for aging and disability services shall serve as chairperson of the council. The 18 19 appointive members of the council shall serve at the pleasure of their 20 appointing authority. Members of the voluntary oversight council shall not 21 be paid compensation, subsistence allowances, mileage or other expenses 22 as otherwise may be authorized by law for attending meetings, or 23 subcommittee meetings, of the council.

24 (k) The secretary for aging and disability services shall report to the 25 governor and to the legislature on or before December 31, 1995, and each year thereafter on or before such date, of each year an analysis of the 26 27 information collected under this section. In addition, the secretary for 28 aging and disability services shall provide data from the CARE data forms 29 to the Kansas department of health and environment. Such data shall be 30 provided in such a manner so as not to identify individuals.

31 (1) (1) Notwithstanding any other provision of law to the contrary, the 32 secretary for aging and disability services shall withdraw any request for 33 proposal, any solicitation for bids or information or any offer to any 34 person or organization other than area agencies on aging for the 35 provision of assessment services under the CARE program. Contracts 36 executed pursuant to this section for the provision of assessment services 37 under the CARE program shall not be subject to the competitive bid 38 requirements established by K.S.A. 75-3737a et seq., and amendments 39 thereto, and shall only be executed with area agencies on aging.

40 (2) The provisions of this subsection shall expire on January 1, 2020. 41
