AN ACT concerning education; relating to the Kansas school equity and
 enhancement act; BASE aid amounts; school district local option
 budgets; amending K.S.A. 2017 Supp. 72-5132, as amended by section
 2 of 2018 Substitute for Senate Bill No. 423, and 72-5143, as amended
 by section 4 of 2018 Substitute for Senate Bill No. 423, and repealing
 the existing sections.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Kansas:

9 New Section 1. (a) It is the public policy of the state of Kansas to 10 require school districts to adopt a local option budget pursuant to K.S.A. 11 2017 Supp. 72-5143, and amendments thereto, as part of the system for 12 finance of the educational interests of the state. Commencing in school 13 year 2018-2019, all school districts shall have a local option budget that is 14 at least 15% of such school district's total foundation aid.

15 (b) In any action challenging the adequacy of the state's provision for finance of the educational interests of the state, the aggregate amount of 16 moneys provided for school districts from the adoption of a local option 17 18 budget required under K.S.A. 2017 Supp. 72-5143(a), and amendments 19 thereto, shall be included in determining the adequacy of the amount of 20 total funding provided by the legislature in making suitable provision for 21 finance of the educational interests of the state. The aggregate amount of 22 moneys provided for school districts from the adoption of a local option 23 budget in excess of the amount required under K.S.A. 2017 Supp. 72-24 5143(a), and amendments thereto, also may be included in determining the 25 adequacy of the amount of total funding provided by the legislature in 26 making suitable provision for finance of the educational interests of the 27 state.

New Sec. 2. (a) (1) Subject to the provisions of subsection (e), the provisions of this subsection shall apply in any school year in which the amount of BASE aid is \$4,490 or less.

(2) The board of education of a school district may adopt a local
option budget that does not exceed the local option budget calculated as if
the BASE aid was \$4,490, or that does not exceed the local option budget
as calculated pursuant to K.S.A. 2017 Supp. 72-5143, and amendments
thereto, whichever is greater.

36 (b) The board of education of a school district may adopt a local

option budget that does not exceed the local option budget calculated as if
 the school district received state aid for special education and related
 services equal to the amount of state aid for special education and related
 services received in school year 2008-2009, or that does not exceed the
 local option budget as calculated pursuant to K.S.A. 2017 Supp. 72-5143,
 and amendments thereto, whichever is greater.

(c) The board of any school district may exercise the authority granted under subsection (a) or (b) or both subsections (a) and (b).

9 (d) To the extent that the provisions of K.S.A. 2017 Supp. 72-5143, 10 and amendments thereto, conflict with this section, this section shall 11 control.

12 (e) For school year 2019-2020, and each school year thereafter, the 13 specified dollar amount used in subsection (a) for purposes of determining the local option budget of a school district shall be the specified dollar 14 15 amount used for the immediately preceding school year plus an amount 16 equal to the average percentage increase in the consumer price index for 17 all urban consumers in the midwest region as published by the bureau of labor statistics of the United States department of labor during the three 18 19 immediately preceding school years.

Sec. 3. K.S.A. 2017 Supp. 72-5132, as amended by section 2 of 2018
Substitute for Senate Bill No. 423, is hereby amended to read as follows:
72-5132. As used in the Kansas school equity and enhancement act,
K.S.A. 2017 Supp. 72-5131 et seq., and amendments thereto:

24 (a) "Adjusted enrollment" means the enrollment of a school district 25 adjusted by adding the following weightings, if any, to the enrollment of a school district: At-risk student weighting; bilingual weighting; career 26 27 technical education weighting; high-density at-risk student weighting; high 28 enrollment weighting; low enrollment weighting; school facilities 29 weighting: ancillary school facilities weighting: cost-of-living weighting: special education and related services weighting; and transportation 30 31 weighting.

(b) "Ancillary school facilities weighting" means an addend
component assigned to the enrollment of school districts pursuant to
K.S.A. 2017 Supp. 72-5158, and amendments thereto, on the basis of costs
attributable to commencing operation of one or more new school facilities
by such school districts.

(c) (1) "At-risk student" means a student who is eligible for free
meals under the national school lunch act, and who is enrolled in a school
district that maintains an approved at-risk student assistance program.

40 (2) The term "at-risk student" shall not include any student enrolled 41 in any of the grades one through 12 who is in attendance less than full 42 time, or any student who is over 19 years of age. The provisions of this 43 paragraph shall not apply to any student who has an individualized 1 education program.

2 (d) "At-risk student weighting" means an addend component assigned 3 to the enrollment of school districts pursuant to K.S.A. 2017 Supp. 72-4 5151(a), and amendments thereto, on the basis of costs attributable to the 5 maintenance of at-risk educational programs by such school districts.

6 "Base aid for student excellence" or "BASE aid" means an amount (e) 7 appropriated by the legislature in a fiscal year for the designated year. The 8 amount of BASE aid shall be as follows: 9

- For school year 2018-2019, \$4,900 \$4,165; (1)
- 10 for school year 2019-2020, \$5,061 \$4,302; (2)
- (3) for school year 2020-2021, \$5,222 \$4,439; 11
- 12 (4) for school year 2021-2022, \$5,384 \$4,576;
- 13
- (5) for school year 2022-2023, \$5,545 *\$4,713*; and

for school year 2023-2024, and each school year thereafter, the 14 (6) BASE aid shall be the BASE aid amount for the immediately preceding 15 16 school year plus an amount equal to the average percentage increase in the 17 consumer price index for all urban consumers in the midwest region as 18 published by the bureau of labor statistics of the United States department 19 of labor during the three immediately preceding school years rounded to 20 the nearest whole dollar amount.

21 "Bilingual weighting" means an addend component assigned to (f) 22 the enrollment of school districts pursuant to K.S.A. 2017 Supp. 72-5150, 23 and amendments thereto, on the basis of costs attributable to the 24 maintenance of bilingual educational programs by such school districts.

"Board" means the board of education of a school district. (g)

(h) "Budget per student" means the general fund budget of a school 26 27 district divided by the enrollment of the school district.

28 "Categorical fund" means and includes the following funds of a (i) 29 school district: Adult education fund; adult supplementary education fund; 30 at-risk education fund; bilingual education fund; career and postsecondary 31 education fund; driver training fund; educational excellence grant program fund; extraordinary school program fund; food service fund; parent 32 33 education program fund; preschool-aged at-risk education fund; 34 professional development fund; special education fund; and summer 35 program fund.

36 (j) "Cost-of-living weighting" means an addend component assigned 37 to the enrollment of school districts pursuant to K.S.A. 2017 Supp. 72-38 5159, and amendments thereto, on the basis of costs attributable to the cost 39 of living in such school districts.

"Current school year" means the school year during which state 40 (k) 41 foundation aid is determined by the state board under K.S.A. 2017 Supp. 72-5134, and amendments thereto. 42

(1) "Enrollment" means: 43

1 (1) The number of students regularly enrolled in kindergarten and 2 grades one through 12 in the school district on September 20 of the 3 preceding school year plus the number of preschool-aged at-risk students 4 regularly enrolled in the school district on September 20 of the current 5 school year, except a student who is a foreign exchange student shall not 6 be counted unless such student is regularly enrolled in the school district 7 on September 20 and attending kindergarten or any of the grades one 8 through 12 maintained by the school district for at least one semester or 9 two quarters, or the equivalent thereof.

10 (2) If the enrollment in a school district in the preceding school year 11 has decreased from enrollment in the second preceding school year, the 12 enrollment of the school district in the current school year means the sum 13 of:

(A) The enrollment in the second preceding school year, excluding
students under paragraph (2)(B), minus enrollment in the preceding school
year of preschool-aged at-risk students, if any, plus enrollment in the
current school year of preschool-aged at-risk students, if any; and

18 (B) the adjusted enrollment in the second preceding school year of 19 any students participating in the tax credit for low income students scholarship program pursuant to K.S.A. 2017 Supp. 72-4351 et seq., and 20 21 amendments thereto, in the preceding school year, if any, plus the adjusted 22 enrollment in the preceding school year of preschool-aged at-risk students 23 who are participating in the tax credit for low income students scholarship 24 program pursuant to K.S.A. 2017 Supp. 72-4351 et seq., and amendments 25 thereto, in the current school year, if any.

(3) For any school district that has a military student, as that term is
defined in K.S.A. 2017 Supp. 72-5139, and amendments thereto, enrolled
in such district, and that received federal impact aid for the preceding
school year, if the enrollment in such school district in the preceding
school year has decreased from enrollment in the second preceding school
year, the enrollment of the school district in the current school year means
whichever is the greater of:

(A) The enrollment determined under paragraph (2); or

(B) the sum of the enrollment in the preceding school year of
 preschool-aged at-risk students, if any, and the arithmetic mean of the sum
 of:

(i) The enrollment of the school district in the preceding school year
minus the enrollment in such school year of preschool-aged at-risk
students, if any;

40 (ii) the enrollment in the second preceding school year minus the 41 enrollment in such school year of preschool-aged at-risk students, if any; 42 and

43 (iii) the enrollment in the third preceding school year minus the

1 enrollment in such school year of preschool-aged at-risk students, if any.

2 (4) The enrollment determined under paragraph (1), (2) or (3), except if the school district begins to offer kindergarten on a full-time basis in 3 4 such school year, students regularly enrolled in kindergarten in the school district in the preceding school year shall be counted as one student 5 6 regardless of actual attendance during such preceding school year.

7 (m) "February 20" has its usual meaning, except that in any year in 8 which February 20 is not a day on which school is maintained, it means 9 the first day after February 20 on which school is maintained.

"Federal impact aid" means an amount equal to the federally 10 (n) qualified percentage of the amount of moneys a school district receives in 11 the current school year under the provisions of title I of public law 874 and 12 congressional appropriations therefor, excluding amounts received for 13 14 assistance in cases of major disaster and amounts received under the lowrent housing program. The amount of federal impact aid shall be 15 16 determined by the state board in accordance with terms and conditions 17 imposed under the provisions of the public law and rules and regulations thereunder. 18

19 (0)"General fund" means the fund of a school district from which 20 operating expenses are paid and in which is deposited all amounts of state 21 foundation aid provided under this act, payments under K.S.A. 2017 Supp. 22 72-528, and amendments thereto, payments of federal funds made 23 available under the provisions of title I of public law 874, except amounts 24 received for assistance in cases of major disaster and amounts received 25 under the low-rent housing program and such other moneys as are 26 provided by law.

27 (p) "General fund budget" means the amount budgeted for operating 28 expenses in the general fund of a school district.

(q) "High-density at-risk student weighting" means an addend 29 component assigned to the enrollment of school districts pursuant to 30 31 K.S.A. 2017 Supp. 72-5151(b), and amendments thereto, on the basis of 32 costs attributable to the maintenance of at-risk educational programs by 33 such school districts.

34 (r) "High enrollment weighting" means an addend component 35 assigned to the enrollment of school districts pursuant to K.S.A. 2017 36 Supp. 72-5149(b), and amendments thereto, on the basis of costs 37 attributable to maintenance of educational programs by such school 38 districts

39 (s) "Juvenile detention facility" means the same as such term is defined in K.S.A. 2017 Supp. 72-1173, and amendments thereto. 40 41

(t) "Local foundation aid" means the sum of the following amounts:

42 (1) The amount of the proceeds from the tax levied under the-43 authority of K.S.A. 2017 Supp. 72-5147, and amendments thereto, that is

1 levied to finance that portion of the school district's local option budget

2 that is required pursuant to K.S.A. 2017 Supp. 72-5143(a), and

amendments thereto, and not financed from any other source provided by
 law;

5 (2) an amount equal to that portion of the school district's-6 supplemental state aid determined pursuant to K.S.A. 2017 Supp. 72-5145, 7 and amendments thereto, to equalize that portion of the school district's 8 local option budget that is required pursuant to K.S.A. 2017 Supp. 72-9 5143(a), and amendments thereto, and not financed from any other source 10 provided by law;

11 (3) An amount equal to any unexpended and unencumbered balance 12 remaining in the general fund of the school district, except moneys 13 received by the school district and authorized to be expended for the 14 purposes specified in K.S.A. 2017 Supp. 72-5168, and amendments 15 thereto;

16 (4)(2) an amount equal to any remaining proceeds from taxes levied 17 under authority of K.S.A. 72-7056 and 72-7072, and amendments thereto, 18 prior to their repeal;

19 (5)(3) an amount equal to the amount deposited in the general fund in 20 the current school year from moneys received in such school year by the 21 school district under the provisions of K.S.A. 2017 Supp. 72-3123(a), and 22 amendments thereto;

(6)(4) an amount equal to the amount deposited in the general fund in
 the current school year from moneys received in such school year by the
 school district pursuant to contracts made and entered into under authority
 of K.S.A. 2017 Supp. 72-3125, and amendments thereto;

27 (7)(5) an amount equal to the amount credited to the general fund in 28 the current school year from moneys distributed in such school year to the 29 school district under the provisions of articles 17 and 34 of chapter 12 of 30 the Kansas Statutes Annotated, and amendments thereto, and under the 31 provisions of articles 42 and 51 of chapter 79 of the Kansas Statutes 32 Annotated, and amendments thereto;

33 (8)(6) an amount equal to the amount of payments received by the
school district under the provisions of K.S.A. 2017 Supp. 72-3423, and
amendments thereto;

36 (9)(7) an amount equal to the amount of any grant received by the 37 school district under the provisions of K.S.A. 2017 Supp. 72-3425, and 38 amendments thereto; and

(u) "Low enrollment weighting" means an addend component
assigned to the enrollment of school districts pursuant to K.S.A. 2017
Supp. 72-5149(a), and amendments thereto, on the basis of costs

attributable to maintenance of educational programs by such school
 districts.

3 (v) "Operating expenses" means the total expenditures and lawful 4 transfers from the general fund of a school district during a school year for 5 all purposes, except expenditures for the purposes specified in K.S.A. 6 2017 Supp. 72-5168, and amendments thereto.

7 (w) "Preceding school year" means the school year immediately 8 before the current school year.

9 (x) "Preschool-aged at-risk student" means an at-risk student who has attained the age of three years, is under the age of eligibility for attendance at kindergarten, and has been selected by the state board in accordance with guidelines governing the selection of students for participation in head start programs.

(y) "Preschool-aged exceptional children" means exceptional
children, except gifted children, who have attained the age of three years
but are under the age of eligibility for attendance at kindergarten. The
terms "exceptional children" and "gifted children" have the same meaning
as those terms are defined in K.S.A. 2017 Supp. 72-3404, and amendments
thereto.

(z) "Psychiatric residential treatment facility" means the same as such term is defined in K.S.A. 2017 Supp. 72-1173, and amendments thereto.

(aa) "School district" means a school district organized under the laws of this state that is maintaining public school for a school term in accordance with the provisions of K.S.A. 2017 Supp. 72-3115, and amendments thereto.

(bb) "School facilities weighting" means an added addend component
assigned to the enrollment of school districts pursuant to K.S.A. 2017
Supp. 72-5156, and amendments thereto, on the basis of costs attributable
to commencing operation of one or more new school facilities by such
school districts.

(cc) "School year" means the 12-month period ending June 30.

(dd) "September 20" has its usual meaning, except that in any year in
which September 20 is not a day on which school is maintained, it means
the first day after September 20 on which school is maintained.

(ee) "Special education and related services weighting" means an
addend component assigned to the enrollment of school districts pursuant
to K.S.A. 2017 Supp. 72-5157, and amendments thereto, on the basis of
costs attributable to the maintenance of special education and related
services by such school districts.

(ff) "State board" means the state board of education.

41 (gg) "State foundation aid" means the amount of aid distributed to a
42 school district as determined by the state board pursuant to K.S.A. 2017
43 Supp. 72-5134, and amendments thereto.

(hh) (1) "Student" means any person who is regularly enrolled in a 1 2 school district and attending kindergarten or any of the grades one through 3 12 maintained by the school district or who is regularly enrolled in a 4 school district and attending kindergarten or any of the grades one through 12 in another school district in accordance with an agreement entered into 5 6 under authority of K.S.A. 2017 Supp. 72-13,101, and amendments thereto, 7 or who is regularly enrolled in a school district and attending special 8 education services provided for preschool-aged exceptional children by the 9 school district.

10 (2) (A) Except as otherwise provided in this subsection, the following 11 shall be counted as one student:

(i) A student in attendance full-time; and

(ii) a student enrolled in a school district and attending specialeducation and related services, provided for by the school district.

(B) The following shall be counted as $\frac{1}{2}$ student:

(i) A student enrolled in a school district and attending special
education and related services for preschool-aged exceptional children
provided for by the school district; and

(ii) a preschool-aged at-risk student enrolled in a school district and
 receiving services under an approved at-risk student assistance plan
 maintained by the school district.

22 (C) A student in attendance part-time shall be counted as that 23 proportion of one student (to the nearest 1/10) that the student's attendance 24 bears to full-time attendance.

25 (D) A student enrolled in and attending an institution of postsecondary education that is authorized under the laws of this state to 26 27 award academic degrees shall be counted as one student if the student's 28 postsecondary education enrollment and attendance together with the 29 student's attendance in either of the grades 11 or 12 is at least $\frac{5}{6}$ time, otherwise the student shall be counted as that proportion of one student (to 30 31 the nearest $\frac{1}{10}$ that the total time of the student's postsecondary education 32 attendance and attendance in grades 11 or 12, as applicable, bears to full-33 time attendance.

34 (E) A student enrolled in and attending a technical college, a career technical education program of a community college or other approved 35 36 career technical education program shall be counted as one student, if the 37 student's career technical education attendance together with the student's 38 attendance in any of grades nine through 12 is at least 5/6 time, otherwise 39 the student shall be counted as that proportion of one student (to the 40 nearest $\frac{1}{10}$ that the total time of the student's career technical education attendance and attendance in any of grades nine through 12 bears to full-41 42 time attendance.

(F) A student enrolled in a school district and attending a non-virtual

1 school and also attending a virtual school shall be counted as that 2 proportion of one student (to the nearest 1/10) that the student's attendance 3 at the non-virtual school bears to full-time attendance.

4 (G) A student enrolled in a school district and attending special 5 education and related services provided for by the school district and also 6 attending a virtual school shall be counted as that proportion of one 7 student (to the nearest 1/10) that the student's attendance at the non-virtual 8 school bears to full-time attendance.

9 (H) (i) Except as provided in clause (ii), a student enrolled in a school 10 district who is not a resident of Kansas shall be counted as follows:

(a) For school year 2018-2019, one student;

(b) for school years 2019-2020 and 2020-2021, $\frac{3}{4}$ of a student; and

13 (c) for school year 2021-2022 and each school year thereafter, $\frac{1}{2}$ of a 14 student.

(ii) This subparagraph (H) shall not apply to:

(a) A student whose parent or legal guardian is an employee of theschool district where such student is enrolled; or

(b) a student who attended public school in Kansas during school
 year 2016-2017 and who attended public school in Kansas during the
 immediately preceding school year.

21 22 (3) The following shall not be counted as a student:

(A) An individual residing at the Flint Hills job corps center;

(B) except as provided in paragraph (2), an individual confined in and
 receiving educational services provided for by a school district at a
 juvenile detention facility; and

(C) an individual enrolled in a school district but housed, maintained
 and receiving educational services at a state institution or a psychiatric
 residential treatment facility.

(4) A student enrolled in virtual school pursuant to K.S.A. 72-3711 et
seq., and amendments thereto, shall be counted in accordance with the
provisions of K.S.A. 2017 Supp. 72-3715, and amendments thereto.

(ii) "Total foundation aid" means an amount equal to the product
 obtained by multiplying the BASE aid by the adjusted enrollment of a
 school district.

(jj) "Transportation weighting" means an addend component assigned
to the enrollment of school districts pursuant to K.S.A. 2017 Supp. 725148, and amendments thereto, on the basis of costs attributable to the
provision or furnishing of transportation.

(kk) "Virtual school" means the same as such term is defined inK.S.A. 2017 Supp. 72-3712, and amendments thereto.

41 Sec. 4. K.S.A. 2017 Supp. 72-5143, as amended by section 4 of 2018
42 Substitute for Senate Bill No. 423, is hereby amended to read as follows:
43 72-5143. (a) In each school year, the board of education of a school district

shall adopt, by resolution, a local option budget equal to 15% of the school
 district's total foundation aid.

3 (b) If the board of education of a school district desires local option 4 budget authority above the amount required under subsection (a), the 5 board may adopt, by resolution, a local option budget in an amount that 6 does not exceed 27.5% of the school district's total foundation aid the 7 statewide average for the preceding school year as determined by the state board pursuant to subsection (j). The adoption of a resolution pursuant to 8 this section shall require a majority vote of the members of the board. 9 10 Such resolution shall be effective upon adoption and shall require no other procedure, authorization or approval. 11

12 (c) If the board of a school district desires local option budget 13 authority above the amount authorized under subsection (b), the board may adopt, by resolution, such budget in an amount not to exceed the state 14 prescribed percentage. The adoption of a resolution pursuant to this 15 subsection shall require a majority vote of the members of the board. The 16 17 resolution shall be published at least once in a newspaper having general 18 circulation in the school district. The resolution shall be published in 19 substantial compliance with the following form:

23 Be It Resolved that:

24 The board of education of the above-named school district shall be 25 authorized to adopt a local option budget in each school year in an amount not to exceed % of the amount of total foundation aid. The local 26 option budget authorized by this resolution may be adopted, unless a 27 28 petition in opposition to the same, signed by not less than 10% of the 29 qualified electors of the school district, is filed with the county election 30 officer of the home county of the school district within 40 days after 31 publication of this resolution. If a petition is filed, the county election 32 officer shall submit the question of whether adoption of the local option 33 budget shall be authorized to the electors of the school district at an 34 election called for the purpose or at the next general election, as is specified by the board of education of the school district. 35

42 All of the blanks in the resolution shall be filled appropriately. If a 43 sufficient petition is not filed, the board may adopt a local option budget. 1 If a sufficient petition is filed, the board may notify the county election 2 officer of the date of an election to be held to submit the question of 3 whether adoption of a local option budget shall be authorized. Any such 4 election shall be noticed, called and held in the manner provided by K.S.A. 5 10-120, and amendments thereto. If the board fails to notify the county 6 election officer within 30 days after a sufficient petition is filed, the 7 resolution shall be deemed abandoned and no like resolution shall be 8 adopted by the board within the nine months following publication of the 9 resolution.

(d) Unless specifically stated otherwise in the resolution, the authority
to adopt a local option budget shall be continuous and permanent. *The board of any school district that is authorized to adopt a local option budget may adopt a budget in an amount less than the amount authorized, provided the board adopts a local option budget in an amount equal to or greater than the amount required under subsection (a).*

(e) The board of any school district may initiate procedures to renew
or increase the authority to adopt a local option budget at any time during
a school year after the tax levied pursuant to K.S.A. 2017 Supp. 72-5147,
and amendments thereto, is certified to the county clerk under any existing
authorization.

21 (f) (1) Except as provided in paragraph (2), the board of any school 22 district authorized to adopt a local option budget prior to July 1, 2017, 23 under a resolution that authorized the adoption of such budget in 24 accordance with the provisions of K.S.A. 2017 Supp. 72-6471, prior to 25 July 1, 2017, may continue to operate under such resolution for the period of time specified in the resolution if such resolution adopted a local option 26 27 budget equal to or greater than the amount required in subsection (a), or 28 may abandon the resolution and operate under the provisions of this 29 section. Any such school district shall operate under the provisions of this 30 section after the period of time specified in any previously adopted 31 resolution has expired.

(2) Any resolution adopted prior to July 1, 2017, pursuant to K.S.A.
72-6433(e)(2), prior to its repeal, that authorized the adoption of a local
option budget and that was not subsequently submitted to and approved by
a majority of the qualified electors of the school district voting at an
election called and held thereon shall expire on June 30, 2018, and shall
have no force and effect during school year 2018-2019 or any subsequent
school year.

(g) Any resolution adopted pursuant to this section may revoke or repeal any resolution previously adopted by the board. If the resolution does not revoke or repeal previously adopted resolutions, all resolutions that are in effect shall expire on the same date. The maximum amount of the local option budget of a school district under all resolutions in effect

1 shall not exceed the state prescribed percentage in any school year.

2 (h) For school year 2019-2020 and each school year thereafter, the 3 board of any school district that desires to increase its local option budget 4 authority for the immediately succeeding school year shall submit written 5 notice of such intent to the state board by April 1 of the current school 6 year. Such notice shall include the local option budget authority, expressed 7 as a percentage of the school district's total foundation aid, to be adopted 8 for the immediately succeeding school year. The board of a school district 9 shall not adopt a local option budget in excess of the authority stated in a 10 notice submitted pursuant to this subsection.

(i) (1) There is hereby established in each school district that adopts a
 local option budget a supplemental general fund, which shall consist of all
 amounts deposited therein or credited thereto according to law.

(2) (A) Of the moneys deposited in or otherwise credited to the 14 supplemental general fund of a school district pursuant to K.S.A. 2017 15 16 Supp. 72-5147, and amendments thereto, an amount that is proportional to 17 that amount of such school district's total foundation aid attributable to the 18 at-risk student weighting as compared to such district's total foundation aid 19 shall be transferred to the at-risk education fund of such school district and 20 shall be expended in accordance with K.S.A. 2017 Supp. 72-5153, and 21 amendments thereto.

22 (B) Of the moneys deposited in or otherwise credited to the 23 supplemental general fund of a school district pursuant to K.S.A. 2017 24 Supp. 72-5147, and amendments thereto, an amount that is proportional to 25 that amount of such school district's total foundation aid attributable to the 26 bilingual weighting as compared to such district's total foundation aid shall 27 be transferred to the bilingual education fund of such school district and 28 shall be expended in accordance with K.S.A. 2017 Supp. 72-3613, and 29 amendments thereto.

30 (3) Subject to the limitations imposed under paragraph (4), amounts 31 in the supplemental general fund may be expended for any purpose for 32 which expenditures from the general fund are authorized or may be 33 transferred to any categorical fund of the school district. Amounts in the 34 supplemental general fund attributable to any percentage over 25% of total 35 foundation aid determined for the current school year may be transferred 36 to the capital improvements fund of the school district and the capital 37 outlay fund of the school district if such transfers are specified in the 38 resolution authorizing the adoption of a local option budget in excess of 39 25%.

40 (4) Amounts in the supplemental general fund may not be expended
41 for the purpose of making payments under any lease-purchase agreement
42 involving the acquisition of land or buildings that is entered into pursuant
43 to the provisions of K.S.A. 2017 Supp. 72-1149, and amendments thereto.

1 (5) (A) Except as provided in subparagraph (B), any unexpended 2 moneys remaining in the supplemental general fund of a school district at 3 the conclusion of any school year in which a local option budget is 4 adopted shall be maintained in such fund.

5 (B) If the school district received supplemental state aid in the school 6 year, the state board shall determine the ratio of the amount of 7 supplemental general state aid received to the amount of the local option 8 budget of the school district for the school year and multiply the total 9 amount of the unexpended moneys remaining by such ratio. An amount 10 equal to the amount of the product shall be transferred to the general fund of the school district or remitted to the state treasurer in accordance with 11 12 the provisions of K.S.A. 75-4215, and amendments thereto. Upon receipt 13 of any such remittance, the state treasurer shall deposit the same in the 14 state treasury to the credit of the state school district finance fund.

15 (i) Each year, the state board shall determine the statewide average 16 percentage of local option budgets legally adopted by school districts for 17 the preceding school year.

18 (k) The provisions of this section shall be subject to the provisions of 19 K.S.A. 2017 Supp. 72-5144 section 2, and amendments thereto.

 (\mathbf{k}) As used in this section:

21 "Authorized to adopt a local option budget" means that a school (1)22 district has adopted a resolution pursuant to subsection (c).

23 (2) "State prescribed percentage" means 30.5% 33% of the total 24 foundation aid of the school district in the current school year.

25 (3) For purposes of determining the school district's local optionbudget under subsections (a), (b) and (c), "Total foundation aid" means the 26 27 same as such term is defined in K.S.A. 2017 Supp. 72-5132, and 28 amendments thereto, except the state aid for special education and related 29 services shall be divided by an amount equal to 85% of the BASE aid-30 amount, and the resulting quotient shall be used in determining the school 31 district's total foundation aid.
