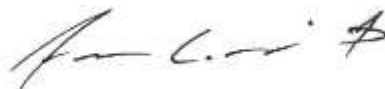
**SUBJECT:** Fiscal Note for SB 403 by Senate Committee on Assessment and Taxation

In accordance with KSA 75-3715a, the following fiscal note concerning SB 403 is respectfully submitted to your committee.

SB 403 would allow Wilson County to place on the ballot a question imposing a sales tax at the rate of 0.25 percent, 0.5 percent, 0.75 percent, or 1.0 percent for the purpose of supporting emergency medical and ambulance services. The tax would expire after ten years, and the county could submit a question to the county electors imposing the tax for additional ten-year periods.

The Department of Revenue indicates SB 403 would affect only local sales tax collections in Wilson County and would have no fiscal effect on state revenues. The Department indicates that the administrative costs associated with implementing the provisions of the bill would be negligible and could be absorbed within existing resources.
