SUPPLEMENTAL NOTE ON HOUSE BILL NO. 2674

As Amended by House Committee on
Corrections and Juvenile Justice

Brief*

HB 2674, as amended, would amend the statute governing forfeiture of appearance bonds in the Kansas Code of Criminal Procedure.

The bill would require, if a defendant fails to appear as directed by the court and guaranteed by an appearance bond, the court in which the bond is deposited to issue an arrest warrant for a defendant.

The bill would add to the circumstances under which a court would direct a forfeiture to be set aside the following:

- The arrest warrant required by the above provision was not issued within 14 days of the forfeiture;
- The surety has submitted a written request to the court in the county where the forfeiture occurred, requesting the court to order the sheriff to enter the warrant for the defendant into the National Crime Information Center's index, and such warrant was not entered within 14 days of the date of the court order to the sheriff, unless good cause is shown for the failure to timely enter such warrant into the index; or
- The defendant has been arrested outside of Kansas, and the prosecuting attorney has declined to proceed with extradition.

The bill would clarify that a court could impose conditions when it is required to direct that a forfeiture be set aside. Finally, the bill would reorganize some existing provisions within the statute and make other technical amendments to ensure consistency in statutory phrasing and organization.

Background

The bill was introduced by the House Committee on Judiciary at the request of the Kansas Bail Agents Association.

House Committee on Corrections and Juvenile Justice

In the House Committee hearing on February 14, 2022, a representative of the Kansas Bail Agents Association testified as a **proponent** of the bill, stating the bill would address situations in some Kansas jurisdictions where an arrest warrant is not issued or is issued after delay when a defendant fails to appear on a surety bond. No other testimony was provided.

On February 16, 2022, the House Committee amended the bill to adjust the procedure by which the surety can request the warrant be entered into the index.

Fiscal Information

According to the fiscal note prepared by the Division of the Budget on the bill, as introduced, the Office of Judicial Administration indicates enactment of the bill would have a negligible fiscal effect on Judicial Branch operations.

The Kansas Association of Counties indicates any fiscal effect on counties would be negligible.
