Dear Chairman Huebert,

I am writing today because I do NOT have a vaccine injury story. None of my children have ever received a vaccine. The reason for this is because I committed to hours and hours of research during my first pregnancy.

My children are the healthiest children I know. They have never been prescribed an antibiotic and have never had to be seen by a doctor in an urgent care situation. The very few times that they have had a cold or a stomach bug, they have been able to quickly bounce back and have never been sick for longer than a day.

Both children are extremely smart and score within or above their grade level consistently. They do not have any food allergies or other allergies. They do not have any autoimmune diseases or health concerns.

When my daughter was a newborn, our first pediatrician made it very clear at our first appointment that she required parents to vaccinate. There was no discussion, she just wouldn't be willing to care for my child unless I followed the schedule set out by the CDC. Instead of arguing, we decided to find a new Pediatrician. Our second pediatrician tolerated it but at our six month appointment he actually decided that it was okay to yell at me and accuse me of being an unfit mother for not vaccinating my child. He didn't even try to answer any of my questions. There was to be no discussion. I left and never went back. This is very dangerous because this takes the patient out of the care of a doctor and due to the experience, they may not seek for a new one to continue care.

As a dedicated Christian I take very seriously the command for followers of Christ to hold sacred life as a God given gift. I have watched the testimony from 2019 of Dr. Plotkin. He openly admits that in only ONE vaccine they experimented on more than 70 aborted babies until they found the two that they actually used in the vaccine. Other groups they tested vaccines on were the mentally handicapped, orphans, and persons who were incarcerated.

I also decided that there was a substantial amount of research that had been done into the negative effects of aluminum in the brain and due to my family's genetic predisposition to alzheimers (patients have been found to have high levels of aluminum in the brain), I felt like it wasn't worth the risk. Over the years I continued to do my research and, as with all pharmacological products, there is risk. Where there is risk, there must be choice.

I will not go into all of my other concerns with vaccines in this letter. All that I ask for is choice. Forcing any medical procedure on a person also goes directly against the Nuremburg code and there is a reason why that was enacted.
