
What is K-TRACS?

Secure, 24/7 webaccessible database, that monitors Schedule II-IV controlled substance prescriptions, and drugs of concern dispensed in Kansas Pharmacies are required to report outpatient prescriptions daily. (Exempt – hospitals for inpatient care, LTC, veterinarians, hospice)

K-TRACS data is privileged and confidential

- Pharmacists and Prescribers MAY access.
- De-identified data available for statistical, research or educational purposes

Interact

Prescribers and pharmacists may use a 24/7, web-accessible, secure database of controlled substance prescriptions for Kansas patients.

Inform

K-TRACS helps clinical decision-making by providing patient's controlled substance prescription history which results in better outcomes and can ultimately save lives.

Improve

Use of K-TRACS can improve patient care, safety, education, and outcomes through detection, prevention, and intervention while preserving access for patients with legitimate medical needs.


Advisory Committee

- Prescribers, Pharmacists, and Law Enforcement
- Provide guidance for program development and direction
- Authorized to:
 - review and analyze data for purposes of identifying patterns and activity of concern
 - notify the prescribers and dispensers who prescribed or dispensed the prescriptions
 - notify law enforcement or appropriate regulatory board(s) for additional investigation
- Provide education to healthcare professionals, law enforcement, and the public

Please note that this person has received controlled substances prescriptions written by 13 prescribers and had them filled at 11 pharmacies during the past 3 months. This equals or exceeds the threshold of 5 prescribers and 5 pharmacies and while there may be a valid reason for this, it also may be indicative of the practice of prescriber and pharmacy shopping.




Over 38% of Kansans filled at least one controlled substance prescription in the last year







Statewide Integration





- Kansas prescribers and pharmacists may access K-TRACS data directly through their electronic health records system
 - Improve access, patient support and engagement, and care coordination
 - Reduce barriers
 - Increase utilization of K-TRACS 7 fold increase in queries
- State covers all PDMP Gateway® connection costs for each Kansas healthcare entity approved for integration
- YTD
 - 33 hospitals
 - 130 pharmacies
 - 11 physician offices





NARXCARE





Quarterly report sent to prescribers regarding their prescribing history and behavior.

2,800+ per quarter

PER Prescriber E-Recap

- How many patients you have prescribed opioids to as well as a comparison to those within your specialty.
- Morphine Milligram Equivalent (MME) information is broken out so you can readily see where your opioid prescribing falls within multiple
- MME ranges.
- Opioid treatment duration, which shows the percentage of patients who have been prescribed opioids for fewer than 7 days, 7 to 28 days, 29 to 90 days, or more than 90 days.
- K-TRACS usage, which shows exactly how much you and your delegate(s) are using the PDMP.
- Multiple Provider Episodes (MPE) provide a look at the number of your patients who have met or exceeded the K-TRACS threshold of 5/5/90 five prescribers and five pharmacies within 90 days.
- Dangerous Combination Therapy provides you with details of your patient's combination therapies that may increase a patient's risk for overdose.
