

Legislative Testimony In support of HB 2334 APEX Deadline Extension for Committee on Commerce, Labor and Economic Development Tuesday, February 14, 2023

Thank you for the opportunity to support HB 2334 to extend the life of Attracting Powerful Economic Expansions (APEX) in our state's economic development efforts. The Kansas Economic Development Alliance, (KEDA), is a statewide organization representing more than 125 economic development professionals from all corners of the state.

We believe that HB 2334 provides the ability to extend the life of this **economy-changing** tool.
