PARTNERSHIP EXPERIENCE



Wonderschool partnered with Michigan:

- Recruit new providers into Wonderschool Academy in order to launch 75 new child care programs across the state, specifically targeting high-needs areas
- Train existing child care providers on business technology tools that enable them to operate financially sound and sustainable child care programs
- Create learning toolkits tailored to Michigan's business and licensing standards to
 educate providers about child care best practices, help them access state-funded
 grant opportunities, and ensure they can meet ongoing requirements for licensing and
 compliance. These toolkits are hosted on Wonderschool's learning management system.



GOALS

All project deliverables for this partnership, which began in October 2022, have been completed **2.5 months ahead of project timeline**. Since then, LARA has invested additional funds into Wonderschool programming to expand the original project goals and increase the scope of our work in Michigan.

Wonderschool partnered with the State of Nevada and the Las Vegas Urban League to:

- Increase the supply of Family Child Care programs available to families living in child care deserts
- Optimize business operations for existing child care providers across the state
- Provide on-the-ground individualized support to both new and existing providers.

Deliverables for the original agreement with DWSS included the creation of 50 new child care providers in six months. The result was 86 new child care providers registered in three months—the program was further expanded to target, recruit and enroll 252 new providers to the Wonderschool Academy in less than one year. This goal has been met and exceeded as of June 23, 2023.



This approach was proven effective during the COVID-19 crisis, as only a small fraction of Wonderschool's providers had to close compared to a much larger percentage nationwide. Thanks to their innovative and community-centered efforts, Wonderschool was recognized as one of the Time 100 Most Influential Companies of 2022.

The Challenge in Kansas

The child care challenges in Kansas are pervasive and exist across all populations and geographies within the state.

A child care desert is any census tract with more than 50 children under age five that contains either no child care providers or so few options that there are more than three times as many children as licensed child care slots.

- 74% of children under age six have all available parents participating in the labor force, making this a significant impact on economic growth for nearly every community throughout the state.
- As of today, 45% of Kansas families living in rural areas reside in child care deserts; however, child care desert areas include all ethnicities, geographic regions, and income levels2.
- State-wide, there is a potential need for over 54,480 additional child care slots in order to fill the care gap3.
- Even more challenging, many parents need child care that serves nontraditional hours, especially in sectors such as health care, manufacturing, agriculture and public safety.
- One of the greatest benefits of building a robust network of home-based child care providers is that these providers are typically the most responsive to the needs, values, and expectations of their specific communities. This also opens the opportunity for parental choice for families when they are searching for care.
