AN ACT concerning crimes, punishment and criminal procedure; felating to crimes against persons; creating the crimes of human spruggling and aggravated human smuggling; providing criminal penalties therefor.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Kansas:

Section 1. (a) (1) Human smuggling is transporting, harboring or concealing an individual into or within Kansas who the person knows, or should have known, is entering into or remaining in the United States illegally.

- (2) Aggravated human smuggling is human smuggling that:
- (A) Is committed using a deadly weapon,
- (B) causes bodily harm, great bodily harm or disfigurement to the individual being smuggled; or
- (C) causes the individual being smuggled to become a victim of a sex offense described in article 55 of chapter 21 of the Kansas Statutes Annotated, and amendments thereto.
 - (b) (1) Human smuggling is a severity level 5, person felony; and
 - (2) aggravated human smuggling is a severity level 3, person felony
- (c) This section shall be a part of and supplemental to the Kansas criminal code.
- Sec. 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its publication in the statute book.
