Re: Prison Bed Space Impact Assessment, HB 2216 - Removing the mandatory term of imprisonment as a penalty for driving with license that is canceled, suspended, or revoked for failure to pay fines.

IMPACT ASSESSMENT

- **Impact on Prison Admissions:** This bill will have **no** impact on prison admissions.
- Impact on Prison Beds: This bill will have no impact on prison bed space.
- Impact on the Workload of the Commission: This bill will have no impact on the workload of the Commission.

SUMMARY OF THE BILL

Section 1. K.S.A. 8-262 is amended to include that any person convicted of a violation of this section shall be subject to a fine of not less than \$100. Additionally, language is added that a violation of this section, committed while the person's privilege to drive or privilege to obtain a driver's license was suspended or revoked for any violation other than a violation of K.S.A. 8- 2110, and amendments thereto, or any ordinance of any city, resolution of any county or a law of another state that prohibits the acts prohibited by those statutes other than K.S.A. 8-2110 shall be sentenced to at least five days of confinement and, upon a second conviction, shall not be eligible for parole until completion of five days of confinement.

FINDINGS

- This bill only pertains to *misdemeanor penalties*.
- As such, all incarceration penalties will occur in **county jail**, as opposed to prison.
- Therefore, this bill will have **no** impact on prison admissions, prison bed space, or the workload of the Commission.

SUMMARY

- Impact on Prison Admissions: This bill will have no impact on prison admissions.
- Impact on Prison Beds: This bill will have no impact on prison bed space.
- **Impact on the Workload of the Commission:** This bill will have **no** impact on the workload of the Commission.
