Subject: Bill Brief – House Bill 2030

Section 1 of House Bill 2030 would create a new section of law to authorize any student who is enrolled and attending any nonpublic elementary or secondary school to participate in any KSHSAA activities that are offered by the school district in which such student resides. To be eligible for participation, the student would be required to be resident of the district, be enrolled and attending a nonpublic school, comply with the requirements of K.S.A. 72-6262 relating to student vaccinations, meet the general age and eligibility requirements set forth by KSHSAA that are not in conflict with this section, and pay any required activity fees that are imposed upon other students for participation in such activity. The board of education of a school district is authorized to require a student to enroll a course as a condition of participation if such course is required for participation in the activity.

Section 2 of HB 2030 would provide that KSHSAA shall not prohibit a student who is primarily enrolled in and attending a nonpublic school and who enrolls part time in a public school from participating in any activity that is available to such student as part of the student's enrollment and attendance at the nonpublic school.
