Dear Chair & members of the committee,

I am writing to share my opposition to bill SB 169. This tax proposal, although beneficial to wealthy Kansans and corporations, would hurt middle- and low-income Kansans and greatly reduce the state general fund.

We cannot afford another tax experiment in Kansas. For a similar bill in the House, bill HB 2061, the Kansas Division of Budget has estimated a decrease in state revenues of \$1.5 billion. This will put our state at risk of not meeting its obligations and the needs of its citizens. We've been through a tax experiment before (Governor Brownback didn't get a second term) and we know what it did to our bond rating, our infrastructure, and our kids in public schools.

Our state now has a healthy budget. If you really want to help Kansans, stay focused on initiatives such as:

- Eliminating the food sales tax
- Providing an education tax holiday
- Fully funding special education
- Investing in mental health
- Investing in infrastructure

Legislators did the right thing in 2017 when they reversed the previous tax cuts that decimated our state budget. Please vote no on Bill SB 169.
