ESG Direct Financial Impacts

- 1. Most KS operators would rarely obtain funding from very large financial institutions.
- 2. However oil and gas technology and equipment providers used in KS would.
- 3. These include large public companies providing seismic technology, chemical and well stimulation products, bits, compressors, pipes and other key equipment.

ESG Direct Financial Impacts

- 1. If these large technology and equipment providers cannot obtain financing, this will reduce availability of new technology and products in the KS oil and gas industry.
- 2. This then reduces oil and gas recovery in the long run, which reduces jobs and tax income for the State of KS.

ESG Indirect Financial Impacts

- 1. ESG effects on funding can impact companies that use fossil fuels to provide energy to customers, including generation of electricity.
- 2. The largest cost for most oil and gas operations is electricity.
- 3. ESG limitations would likely increase the cost of electricity to all consumers.

ESG Indirect Financial Impacts

- 1. Higher electricity costs will cause oil and gas companies to shut down oil and gas wells that cannot generate sufficient revenue to pay for the cost of electricity.
- 2. Oil wells shut down in this manner likely will never be restarted, which reduces jobs and tax income to the State of KS.
- 3. Shutting down wells deprives landowners of royalty income and causes a loss of oil and gas reserves.

FINAL COMMENTS

- 1. ESG causes real world negative impacts on Kansas oil and gas producers.
- 2. These negative impacts then will result in reductions in jobs and tax income for the State of Kansas.
- 3. Why would the State of Kansas want public money used in a manner that hurts the economy of Kansas?
