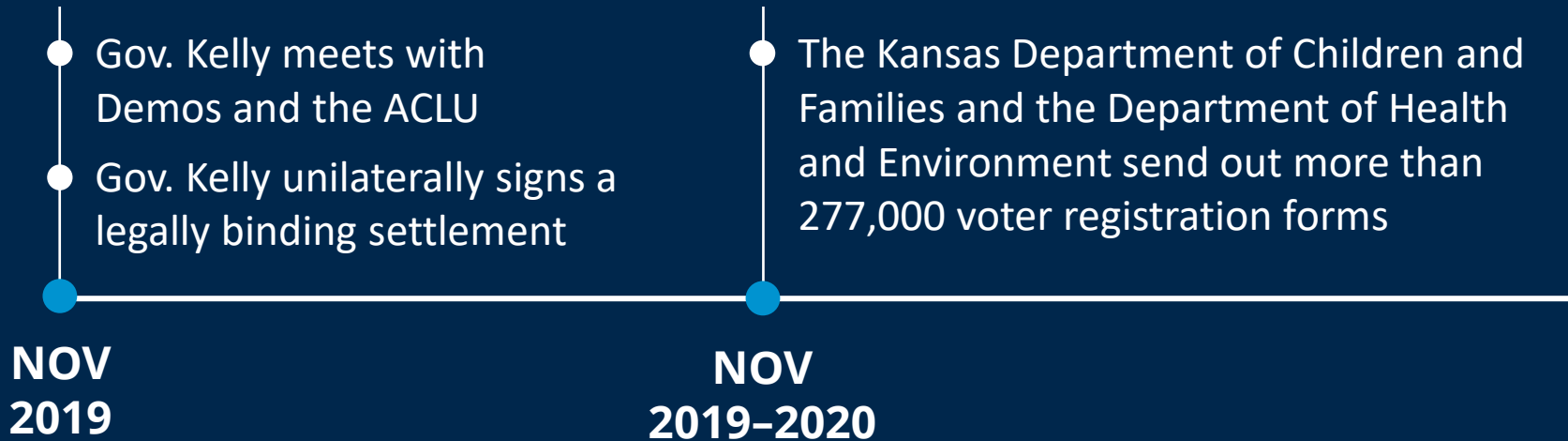

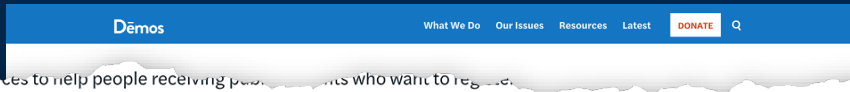

VOTING RIGHTS & ACCESS

Kansans have additional opportunities to register to vote or update their voter registrations through two government agency offices across the state, thanks to an agreement between a coalition of civil rights agencies and the State of Kansas.

The two agencies—the Kansas Department of Health and Environment and the Kansas Department for Children and Families—will expand opportunities for voter registration, in compliance with the National Voter Registration Act (NVRA). Statewide, these agencies have committed to providing additional resources to help people receiving public benefits who want to register to vote.

These changes come after a careful negotiation process between Governor Kelly and Kansas voting rights advocacy non-profit Loud Light, who was represented by think tank Dēmos, the American Civil Liberties Union (ACLU) of Kansas, and the ACLU's national Voting Rights Project.

"This agreement to bring the state of Kansas back into compliance with the National Voter Registration Act is a win for the residents of Kansas, who will now have more access to voter registration and greater opportunity to vote and enjoy full participation in the democratic process," said Brenda Wright, Interim Director of Legal Strategies at Dēmos. "We will continue to work with the state to maintain a seamless registration process for its residents."

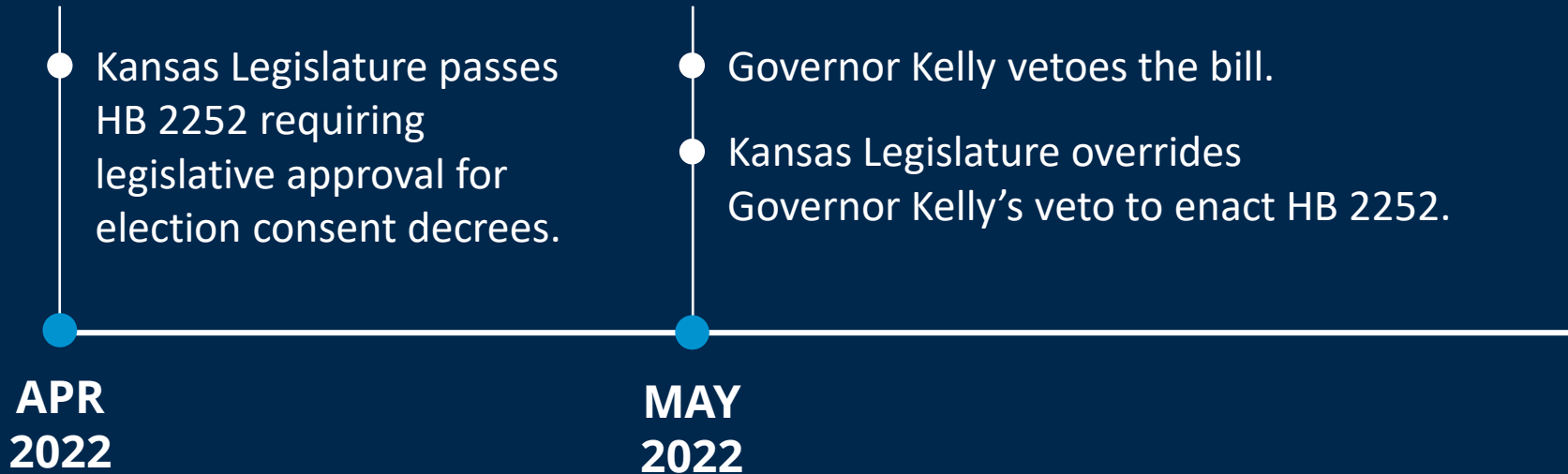



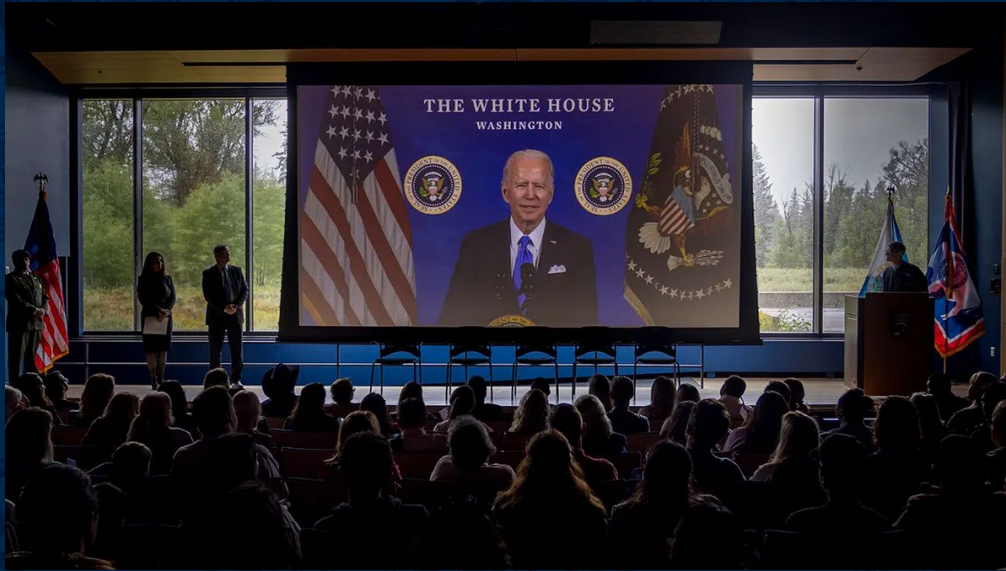

SOLUTIONS:



Require legislative approval for new federal funding and guidance.



Pass legislation declaring null and void any designations under the NVRA made to date by anyone other than the legislature.



Use legislative oversight power in coordination with AG Kobach to investigate these scandals and hold the culprits accountable.
