## HOUSE BILL No. 2146

AN ACT concerning traffic regulations; relating to the uniform fine 1 2 schedule for traffic infractions; increasing penalties for operating a 3 vehicle in excess of 30 miles per hour over the speed limit; increasing 4 penalties for impeding traffic by operating a motor vehicle at a slow speed; directing the division of vehicles to suspend a person's 5 driving privileges for a third or subsequent conviction for 6 operating a vehicle in excess of 30 miles per hour over the speed 7 8 limit; amending K.S.A. 8-255 and 8-2118 and repealing the existing 9 section sections 10 11 Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Kansas: 12 {Section 1. K.S.A. 8-255 is hereby amended to read as follows: 8-255. (a) The division is authorized to restrict, suspend or revoke a 13 14 person's driving privileges upon a showing by its records or other 15 sufficient evidence the person: (1) Has been convicted with such frequency of serious offenses 16 17 against traffic regulations governing the movement of vehicles as to indicate a disrespect for traffic laws and a disregard for the safety of 18 19 other persons on the highways; 20 (2) has been convicted of three or more moving traffic violations committed on separate occasions within a 12-month period; 21 22 (3) is incompetent to drive a motor vehicle; 23 (4) has been convicted of a moving traffic violation, committed at 24 a time when the person's driving privileges were restricted, suspended 25 or revoked: or 26 (5) is a member of the armed forces of the United States stationed 27 at a military installation located in the state of Kansas, and the 28 authorities of the military establishment certify that such person's on-29 base driving privileges have been suspended, by action of the proper 30 military authorities, for violating the rules and regulations of the military installation governing the movement of vehicular traffic or 31 32 for any other reason relating to the person's inability to exercise 33 ordinary and reasonable control in the operation of a motor vehicle. 34 (b) (1) The division shall:

- (A) Suspend a person's driving privileges:
- 36 (i) When required by K.S.A. 8-262, 8-1014 or 41-727, and

1 amendments thereto;

(ii) upon a person's second conviction of theft, as defined in
 subsection (a)(5) of K.S.A. 2022 Supp. 21-5801(a)(5), and amendments
 thereto, for six months; and

5 (iii) upon a person's third or subsequent conviction of theft, as 6 defined in-subsection (a)(5) of K.S.A. 2022 Supp. 21-5801(a)(5), and 7 amendments thereto, for one year; and

*(iv) upon a person's third or subsequent conviction within five years of a previous conviction for operating a vehicle in excess of 30 miles per hour over the speed limit, as described in K.S.A. 8-2118(i)(2), and amendments thereto, for 30 days;* 

(B) disqualify a person's privilege to drive commercial motor
 vehicles when required by K.S.A. 8-2,142, and amendments thereto;
 and

15 (C) restrict a person's driving privileges when required by K.S.A.
 39-7,155, and amendments thereto.

(2) As used in this subsection, "conviction" means a final 17 18 conviction without regard to whether the sentence was suspended or 19 probation granted after such conviction. Forfeiture of bail, bond or 20 collateral deposited to secure a defendant's appearance in court, 21 which forfeiture has not been vacated, shall be equivalent to a 22 conviction. "Conviction" includes being convicted of a violation of 23 K.S.A. 21-3765, prior to its repeal, or subsection (a)(5) of K.S.A. 2022 24 Supp. 21-5801(a)(5), and amendments thereto.

25 (c) When the action by the division restricting, suspending, revoking or disqualifying a person's driving privileges is based upon a 26 report of a conviction or convictions from a convicting court, the 27 28 person may not request a hearing but, within 30 days after notice of 29 restriction, suspension, revocation or disqualification is mailed, may submit a written request for administrative review and provide 30 31 evidence to the division to show the person whose driving privileges 32 have been restricted, suspended, revoked or disqualified by the 33 division was not convicted of the offense upon which the restriction, 34 suspension, revocation or disqualification is based. Within 30 days of 35 its receipt of the request for administrative review, the division shall notify the person whether the restriction, suspension, revocation or 36 37 disqualification has been affirmed or set aside. The request for 38 administrative review shall not stay any action taken by the division.

(d) Upon restricting, suspending, revoking or disqualifying the
driving privileges of any person as authorized by this act, the division
shall immediately notify the person in writing. Except as provided by
K.S.A. 8-1002 and 8-2,145, and amendments thereto, and subsections
(c) and (g), if the person makes a written request for hearing within 30

days after such notice of restriction, suspension or revocation is 1 2 mailed, the division shall afford the person an opportunity for a 3 hearing as early as practical not sooner than five days nor more than 4 30 days after such request is mailed. If the division has not revoked or suspended the person's driving privileges or vehicle registration prior 5 6 to the hearing, the hearing may be held within not to exceed 45 days. 7 Except as provided by K.S.A. 8-1002 and 8-2,145, and amendments 8 thereto, the hearing shall be held in the person's county of residence or a county adjacent thereto, unless the division and the person agree 9 that the hearing may be held in some other county. Upon the hearing, 10 the director or the director's duly authorized agent may administer 11 12 oaths and may issue subpoenas for the attendance of witnesses and the 13 production of relevant books and papers and may require an examination or reexamination of the person. When the action 14 15 proposed or taken by the division is authorized but not required, the 16 division, upon the hearing, shall either rescind or affirm its order of restriction, suspension or revocation or, good cause appearing 17 18 therefor, extend the restriction or suspension of the person's driving 19 privileges, modify the terms of the restriction or suspension or revoke 20 the person's driving privileges. When the action proposed or taken by 21 the division is required, the division, upon the hearing, shall either 22 affirm order of restriction, suspension, revocation its or 23 disqualification, or, good cause appearing therefor, dismiss the 24 administrative action. If the person fails to request a hearing within 25 the time prescribed or if, after a hearing, the order of restriction, suspension, revocation or disqualification is upheld, the person shall 26 27 surrender to the division, upon proper demand, any driver's license in 28 the person's possession.

29 (e) In case of failure on the part of any person to comply with any subpoena issued on behalf of the division or the refusal of any witness 30 31 to testify to any matters regarding which the witness may be lawfully 32 interrogated, the district court of any county, on application of the 33 division, may compel obedience by proceedings for contempt, as in the 34 case of disobedience of the requirements of a subpoena issued from the 35 court or a refusal to testify in the court. Each witness who appears 36 before the director or the director's duly authorized agent by order or 37 subpoena, other than an officer or employee of the state or of a 38 political subdivision of the state, shall receive for the witness' 39 attendance the fees and mileage provided for witnesses in civil cases in 40 courts of record, which shall be audited and paid upon the presentation of proper vouchers sworn to by the witness. 41

42 (f) The division, in the interest of traffic and safety, may establish 43 or contract with a private individual, corporation, partnership or

1 association for the services of driver improvement clinics throughout 2 the state and, upon reviewing the driving record of a person whose 3 driving privileges are subject to suspension under subsection (a)(2), 4 may permit the person to retain such person's driving privileges by 5 attending a driver improvement clinic. Any person other than a 6 person issued a commercial driver's license under K.S.A. 8-2,125 et 7 seq., and amendments thereto, desiring to attend a driver 8 improvement clinic shall make application to the division and such application shall be accompanied by the required fee. The secretary of 9 revenue shall adopt rules and regulations prescribing a driver's 10 improvement clinic fee which shall not exceed \$500 and such rules and 11 regulations deemed necessary for carrying out the provisions of this 12 section, including the development of standards and criteria to be 13 utilized by such driver improvement clinics. Amounts received under 14 this subsection shall be remitted to the state treasurer in accordance 15 16 with the provisions of K.S.A. 75-4215, and amendments thereto. Upon 17 receipt of each such remittance, the state treasurer shall deposit the 18 same in the state treasury as prescribed by subsection (f) of K.S.A. 8-19 267(f), and amendments thereto.

20 (g) When the action by the division restricting a person's driving 21 privileges is based upon certification by the secretary for children and 22 families pursuant to K.S.A. 39-7,155, and amendments thereto, the 23 person may not request a hearing but, within 30 days after notice of 24 restriction is mailed, may submit a written request for administrative 25 review and provide evidence to the division to show the person whose driving privileges have been restricted by the division is not the person 26 27 certified by the secretary for children and families, did not receive 28 timely notice of the proposed restriction from the secretary for 29 children and families or has been decertified by the secretary for 30 children and families. Within 30 days of its receipt of the request for 31 administrative review, the division shall notify the person whether the 32 restriction has been affirmed or set aside. The request for 33 administrative review shall not stay any action taken by the division.

34 (h) Any person whose driving privileges have been suspended 35 subsection (b)(1)(A)(ii) or (b)(1)(A)(iii), shall pav under я 36 reinstatement fee in the amount of \$100 to the division. The division 37 shall remit all revenues received from such fees, at least monthly, to 38 the state treasurer in accordance with the provisions of K.S.A. 75-39 4215, and amendments thereto, for deposit in the state treasury and 40 credit to the state highway fund.}

41 Section 1. Sec. 2. K.S.A. 8-2118 is hereby amended to read as 42 follows: 8-2118. (a) A person charged with a traffic infraction shall, except 43 as provided in subsection (b), appear at the place and time specified in the notice to appear. If the person enters an appearance, waives right to trial,
 pleads guilty or no contest, the fine shall be no greater than that specified
 in the uniform fine schedule in subsection (c) and court costs shall be
 taxed as provided by law.

5 (b) Prior to the time specified in the notice to appear, a person 6 charged with a traffic infraction may enter a written appearance, waive 7 right to trial, plead guilty or no contest and pay the fine for the violation as 8 specified in the uniform fine schedule in subsection (c) and court costs 9 provided by law. Payment may be made in any manner accepted by the court. The traffic citation shall not have been complied with if the payment 10 11 is not honored for any reason, or if the fine and court costs are not paid in 12 full. When a person charged with a traffic infraction makes payment without executing a written waiver of right to trial and plea of guilty or no 13 14 contest, the payment shall be deemed such an appearance, waiver of right 15 to trial and plea of no contest.

16 (c) The following uniform fine schedule shall apply uniformly 17 throughout the state but shall not limit the fine that may be imposed 18 following a court appearance, except an appearance made for the purpose 19 of pleading and payment as permitted by subsection (a). The description of 20 offense contained in the following uniform fine schedule is for reference 21 only and is not a legal definition.

(d) Traffic offenses classified as traffic infractions by this section
shall be classified as ordinance traffic infractions by those cities adopting
ordinances prohibiting the same offenses. A schedule of fines for all
ordinance traffic infractions shall be established by the municipal judge in
the manner prescribed by K.S.A. 12-4305, and amendments thereto. Such
fines may vary from those contained in the uniform fine schedule
contained in subsection (c).

(e) Fines listed in the uniform fine schedule contained in-subsection *subsections* (c) *and* (*i*) shall be doubled if a person is convicted of a traffic
infraction, which *that* is defined as a moving violation in accordance with
rules and regulations adopted pursuant to K.S.A. 8-249, and amendments
thereto, committed within any road construction zone as defined in K.S.A.
8-1458a, and amendments thereto.

(f) For a second violation of K.S.A. 8-1908 or 8-1909, and amendments thereto, within two years after a prior conviction of K.S.A. 8-1908 or 8-1909, and amendments thereto, such person, upon conviction, shall be fined  $1^{1}/_{2}$  times the applicable amount from one, but not both, of the schedules listed in the uniform fine schedule contained in subsection

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(c). For a third violation of K.S.A. 8-1908 or 8-1909, and amendments 1 2 thereto, within two years, after two prior convictions of K.S.A. 8-1908 or 3 8-1909, and amendments thereto, such person, upon conviction, shall be 4 fined two times the applicable amount from one, but not both, of the 5 schedules listed in the uniform fine schedule contained in subsection (c). 6 For a fourth and each succeeding violation of K.S.A. 8-1908 or 8-1909, 7 and amendments thereto, within two years after three prior convictions of 8 K.S.A. 8-1908 or 8-1909, and amendments thereto, such person, upon 9 conviction, shall be fined  $2^{1}/_{2}$  times the applicable amount from one, but not both, of the schedules listed in the uniform fine schedule contained in 10 11 subsection (c).

12 (g) Fines listed in the uniform fine schedule contained in-subsection 13 *subsections* (c) *and* (*i*) relating to exceeding the maximum speed limit, 14 shall be doubled if a person is convicted of exceeding the maximum speed 15 limit in a school zone authorized under K.S.A. 8-1560(a)(4), and 16 amendments thereto.

17 (h) For a second violation of K.S.A. 8-1556, and amendments thereto, 18 within five years after a prior conviction of K.S.A. 8-1556, and amendments thereto, such person, upon conviction, shall be fined \$750 for 19 20 the second violation. For a third and each succeeding violation of K.S.A. 21 8-1556, and amendments thereto, within five years after two prior 22 convictions of K.S.A. 8-1556, and amendments thereto, such person, upon 23 conviction, shall be fined \$1,000 for the third and each succeeding 24 violation.

25 (i) (1) For a second violation of K.S.A. 8-1558 through 8-1560b, and 26 amendments thereto, for operating a vehicle at a speed in excess of 30 27 miles per hour over the speed limit within five years after a prior 28 conviction of K.S.A. 8-1558 through 8-1560b, and amendments thereto, for 29 operating a vehicle at a speed in excess of 30 miles per hour over the 30 speed limit, such person, upon conviction, shall be fined \$750 \$375 plus 31 \$25 \$12 for each mile per hour over 30 miles per hour over the speed 32 limit

33 (2) For a third and each succeeding violation of K.S.A. 8-1558 34 through 8-1560b, and amendments thereto, for operating a vehicle at a 35 speed in excess of 30 miles per hour over the speed limit within five years 36 after two or more prior convictions of K.S.A. 8-1558 through 8-1560b, and 37 amendments thereto, for operating a vehicle at a speed in excess of 30 38 miles per hour over the speed limit, such person, upon conviction, shall be 39 fined \$1,000 \$500 plus \$30 \$15 for each mile per hour over 30 miles per 40 hour over the speed limit.
