AN ACT concerning barbers; relating to the examination and licensure 1 2 thereof; creating a senior status license; providing for certain licensure 3 fees; amending K.S.A. 65-1808, 65-1809, 65-1810, 65-1812, 65-1815, 4 65-1817, 65-1819, 65-1820a and 65-1825a and repealing the existing 5 sections. 6 7 Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Kansas: 8 Section 1. K.S.A. 65-1808 is hereby amended to read as follows: 65-9 1808. It is unlawful for any person to engage in barbering for hire in this 10 state, to operate a barber shop, barber school or barber college, or to 11 employ any person to engage in the practice of barbering as defined in 12 K.S.A. 65-1809, and amendments thereto, except in conformity with the 13 provisions of this act K.S.A. 65-1808 et seq., and amendments thereto. 14 Sec. 2. K.S.A. 65-1809 is hereby amended to read as follows: 65-15 1809. As used in this act: 16 "Board" means the Kansas board of barbering; (a) "administrative officer" means the administrative officer of the 17 (b) 18 board: 19 "license" means a license entitling the person to whom issued to (c) 20 practice barbering, or to operate a barber school, barber college or barber 21 shop: 22 "barber shop" means any place, shop-or, suite, establishment, or (d) 23 chair lease area wherein the practice of barbering is engaged in or carried 24 on: 25 (e) "barber school" or "barber college" means any place or 26 establishment wherein the practice, fundamentals, theories or practical 27 applications of barbering are taught; 28 (f) "barbering" means any one or any-combinations combination of 29 the following practices (when done upon the upper part of the human body 30 for cosmetic purposes and not for the purpose of diseases or physical or 31 mental ailments, and when done for payment, either directly or indirectly, 32 or without payment, for the public generally, upon male or female): 33 Shaving-or of the head, face or neck with a razor, trimming the (1)34 beard or cutting the hair; 35 (2) giving facial or scalp massages or treatments with oils, creams, 36 lotions or other preparations, either by hand or mechanical appliances;

1 (3)singeing, shampooing, *coloring*, *bleaching*, *tinting* or dveing; *the* 2 hair; 3

(4) arranging, perming or waving the hair- or applying tonics; or

4 (5) applying cosmetic preparations, antiseptic powders, oils, clays, or 5 lotions to the scalp, face, neck or upper part of the body;

6 "senior status license" means a license issued to a barber (g)7 pursuant to K.S.A. 65-1812(d), and amendments thereto.

8 Sec. 3. K.S.A. 65-1810 is hereby amended to read as follows: 65-9 1810. (a) No barber school or barber college shall be approved by the 10 board unless:

11 (1) The school or college requires, as a prerequisite to graduation, a 12 course of instruction of not less than 1,200 hours and not more than 1,500 13 hours, as prescribed in rules and regulations by the board, to be completed within 18 months of not more than eight hours in any one working day; 14

15 (2) the course of instruction required by the school or college 16 includes scientific fundamentals of barbering; hygiene; histology of the 17 hair and skin; structure of the head, face and neck; elementary chemistry relating to sterilization and antiseptics; massages and manipulations of the 18 19 muscles of the scalp, skin and neck; cutting, shaving, arranging, perming, 20 waving, curling, coloring, bleaching, tinting and dyeing the hair; and 21 barbering practices for all major ethnic groups residing in the state;

22 (3) all instructors of the school or college have been licensed 23 practicing barbers and hold instructors licenses; and

24 (4) no practice or policy of discrimination is in effect against 25 applicants for admission to the school or college by reason of race, 26 religion, color, national origin or ancestry.

27 (b) An instructor's license shall be granted by the board only after the 28 applicant has passed a two-part examination, prescribed by the board for 29 such purpose, with a grade of not less than 75% on each part of the 30 examination, and has paid the prescribed fee for such examination.

31 Every barber school and every barber college shall designate to (c) 32 the public that it is a barber school or barber college by posting a sign on 33 the front window or entrance with letters not less than six inches in height.

34 (d) No barber school or barber college shall enroll or admit any 35 student unless such student shall make and file in duplicate an application 36 upon a form prescribed and furnished by the board. One copy of such 37 application shall be retained by the school or college, and the school or 38 college shall file the other with the board. Upon enrollment, a student shall 39 pay to the board the fee prescribed for a student learning license. Such 40 license shall be used by the student while enrolled in the school or college 41 and shall be placed next to or near the working area of the student.

42 (e) Barber schools or barber colleges may design courses of study for 43 barbers who have not renewed their licenses for a period of at least three

1 years, for students who have failed at least two examinations conducted by

2 the board to determine fitness to practice barbering or for other purposes 3 as prescribed by the board, including courses of study for professionals in 4 related industries.

5 (f) It shall be unlawful for any person, firm or corporation to operate 6 a barber school or barber college without first obtaining a license from the 7 board, fully complying with the provisions of this act and paying an annual 8 fee for operation.

9 Sec. 4. K.S.A. 65-1812 is hereby amended to read as follows: 65-10 1812. (a) Any person shall be qualified to receive a license to practice barbering if such person: 11

(1) Is at least 16 years of age and of good moral character and 12 13 temperate habits;

14 (2) has graduated from a high school accredited by the appropriate accrediting agency or has otherwise obtained the equivalent of a high 15 16 school education;

17 (3) is a graduate of a barber school or barber college approved by the 18 board or has satisfactorily completed the barber course at an institution 19 under the control of the secretary of corrections or the disciplinary 20 barracks at Fort Leavenworth or has been certified in a related industry, 21 such as barbering in any branch of the United States military service, and 22 has completed a course of study in a licensed Kansas-barber college or 23 barber school or college as prescribed by the board under K.S.A. 65-24 1810(e), and amendments thereto, or has been a cosmetologist licensed by 25 the Kansas board of cosmetology and has completed a course of study in a licensed Kansas-barber college or barber school or college as prescribed 26 27 by the board under K.S.A. 65-1810(e), and amendments thereto; and

28 (4) has paid an examination fee and has passed the examination 29 conducted by the board to determine the fitness of such person to practice 30 barbering.

31 (b) Any person who fails to pass an examination conducted by the 32 board to determine such person's fitness to practice barbering shall be 33 entitled to take the next examination conducted by the board.

34 (c) The board may issue a temporary license to practice barbering to 35 any person who has graduated from an approved barber school or barber 36 college and who makes application to take the next examination for 37 licensure to practice barbering. Such license shall be effective only until 38 the results of the examination are announced. No more than three 39 temporary licenses shall be issued to any one person.

40 (d) The board may issue a senior status license to a barber who no 41 longer practices barbering but:

(1) Has been licensed as a barber for a total of at least 40 years; 42 43

(2) is at least 70 years of age; and

(3) has paid the one-time fee prescribed by the board.

2 Sec. 5. K.S.A. 65-1815 is hereby amended to read as follows: 65-3 1815. The board shall conduct examinations for applicants for licensure to practice barbering at such times and places as the board shall determine; 4 but(a) Examinations shall be given not less than twice-in each year. Such 5 6 examination examinations shall be approved by the board and include both 7 a practical skills demonstration-and, a written-test examination of the 8 applicant's knowledge of hygiene and the fundamentals of the vocation 9 and a written examination of the applicant's knowledge of state laws and rules and regulations pertaining to the practice of barbering. A license to 10 practice shall be issued each applicant who shall satisfactorily pass-both 11 12 the practical demonstration and the written test all three examinations, with a grade of not less than 80%, and shall possess the other-13 qualifications required by law on the practical skills demonstration and a 14 15 grade of not less than 75% on the written examinations. The board-shall 16 may allow an applicant who fails-one part of the an examination to be reexamined only on that part which was failed the examination such 17 applicant failed to satisfactorily pass. Each application to practice shall 18 19 contain, in addition to any other information required by the board or by law, the name, address, social security number, height, weight and age of 20 21 the applicant to whom issued. The board may issue seminar permits to-22 barbers and teachers holding valid licenses from Kansas or any other state 23 or country, to teach and demonstrate the art of advanced barbering. Such 24 seminar permit shall be restricted to prescribed dates and places, but in no 25 instance shall it be valid for more than five days. No such seminar permit 26 shall be required of any barber or teacher demonstrating the art of 27 advanced barbering at no cost to those viewing such demonstration.

Sec. 6. K.S.A. 65-1817 is hereby amended to read as follows: 65-1817. (a) In each fiscal year, the board shall determine the amount of funds which *that* will be required during the next ensuing fiscal year to properly administer the laws-which *that* the board is directed to enforce and administer and shall fix fees in accordance with this section for such ensuing year in such reasonable sums as may be necessary for such purposes.

35 (b) After fixing such fees, the board may charge and collect the fees, 36 in advance for the following purposes, subject to the following limitations: 37 For practical skills demonstration—not more than......\$150 38 For reexamination of practical skills demonstration—not more than.....150 39 For written examination of applicant to practice barbering-not more 40 than......\$100150 For reexamination of written examination of applicant to practice 41 42 barbering—

29	(c) A duplicate license will be issued upon the filing of a statement
30	covering the loss of same and the payment of a fee of \$5 for the issuance
31	of same. Each duplicate shall have the word "duplicate" stamped across
32	the face thereof and will bear the same number as the original.
33	Sec. 7. K.S.A. 65-1819 is hereby amended to read as follows: 65-
34	1819. (a) Every licensed barber, instructor, operator of a barber shop and
35	operator of a barber school or barber college shall annually renew the
36	license and pay the required fee. The expiration date of each license-which
37	that is issued, restored or renewed by the board shall be established by
38	rules and regulations of the board so that licenses are renewed by the board
39	throughout the year on a continuing basis. In each case in which a license
40	is issued, restored or renewed for a period of time of less than one year, the
41	board may prorate the amount of the fee established under K.S.A. 65-
42	1817, and amendments thereto.

(b) A barber, instructor or operator of a barber shop whose license has

1 been expired for a period of less than three years may have the license 2 renewed upon filing with the board a renewal application and payment of the required restoration fee. Any barber, instructor or operator of a barber 3 4 shop whose license has been expired for a period of three or more years 5 may renew the license by filing with the board an application for 6 reexamination, successfully completing such reexamination by the board 7 and paying the required examination and license fees. Upon receipt of 8 such application, payment of fees and passage of reexamination, if applicable, the board may grant a new license according to the provisions 9 10 of K.S.A. 65-1820a, and amendments thereto.

Sec. 8. K.S.A. 65-1820a is hereby amended to read as follows: 65-11 1820a. (a) The board may censure, limit, condition, suspend, revoke or 12 refuse to issue, reinstate or renew a license of any applicant or licensee 13 upon proof that the applicant or licensee: 14 15

(1) Has committed malpractice or incompetency;

16 17 (2) has become afflicted with an infectious or communicable disease;

(3) has advertised by knowingly false or deceptive statements;

(4) has advertised, practiced or attempted to practice under a trade 18 19 name other than one's own:

20 (5) is unable to practice barbering with skill and safety due to current 21 abuse of drugs or alcohol:

22 (6) has committed unprofessional conduct as defined in rules and 23 regulations adopted by the board:

(7) has obtained or attempted to obtain a license for money other than 24 25 the required fee, or for any other thing of value or by fraudulent 26 misrepresentations:

27 (8) has willfully failed to display a license to practice barbering as 28 required by K.S.A. 65-1818, and amendments thereto;

29 (9) has practiced or attempted to practice barbering by fraudulent 30 misrepresentations;

31 (10) has violated any of the sanitation standards adopted by the 32 secretary of health and environment pursuant to K.S.A. 65-1,148, and 33 amendments thereto, for the regulation of barber shops, barber schools and 34 barber colleges;

35 (11) has violated any lawful rules and regulations of the board 36 concerning the operation or management of a barber shop, barber school 37 or barber college; or

38 (12) has been convicted of any felony offense or misdemeanor 39 offense of a crime against persons or involving illegal drugs as determined by the board in rules and regulations, and the licensee or applicant for a 40 license is unable to demonstrate to the board's satisfaction that such person 41 has been sufficiently rehabilitated to warrant the public trust. 42

43 (b) The board, in lieu of or addition to any other penalty prescribed under the provisions of article 18 of chapter 65 of the Kansas Statutes
 Annotated, and amendments thereto, may assess a civil fine against a
 licensee for a violation of the provisions of article 18 of chapter 65 of the
 Kansas Statutes Annotated, and amendments thereto, in an amount not to
 exceed \$1,000.

6 (c) In all matters pending before the board, the board shall have the 7 power to revoke the license of any licensee who voluntarily surrenders 8 such person's or entity's license pending investigation of misconduct or 9 while charges of misconduct against the licensee are pending or 10 anticipated.

(d) All proceedings under the provisions of article 18 of chapter 65 of
the Kansas Statutes Annotated, and amendments thereto, shall be
conducted in accordance with the Kansas administrative procedure act.
Judicial review and civil enforcement of agency actions under the
provisions of article 18 of chapter 65 of the Kansas Statutes Annotated,
and amendments thereto, shall be in accordance with the Kansas judicial
review act.

18 Sec. 9. K.S.A. 65-1825a is hereby amended to read as follows: 65-19 1825a. (a) Except with regard to sanitation standards provided for by 20 K.S.A. 65-1,148, and amendments thereto, the board may adopt rules and 21 regulations necessary to carry out the provisions of this act. The rules and 22 regulations of the board shall be posted for public inspection in the main 23 office of the board and a certified copy thereof shall be filed in the office 24 of the administrative officer of the board. The board may also publish such rules and regulations in publications representing the barbering industry. 25

(b) The board shall furnish a copy of the sanitation standards adopted
pursuant to K.S.A. 65-1,148, and amendments thereto to each person to
whom a license is granted and a copy shall be posted in a conspicuous
place in each barber shop, barber school and barber college by the
manager thereof.

Sec. 10. K.S.A. 65-1808, 65-1809, 65-1810, 65-1812, 65-1815, 651817, 65-1819, 65-1820a and 65-1825a are hereby repealed.

Sec. 11. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after itspublication in the statute book.
