## **HOUSE BILL No. 2314**

AN ACT concerning state-issued devices and networks; relating to social media platforms; prohibiting the use of social media platforms of concern on such devices and networks.

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Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Kansas:

Section 1. (a) No electronic device that is owned or issued to an employee by a state agency shall be used to access a social media platform of concern. All state agencies shall prohibit the installation of any application that allows users to access a social media platform of concern on any electronic device that is issued by the state agency. Any network that is operated by a state agency shall prohibit the use of social media platforms of concern by users who are accessing the network.

- (b) Any state agency that utilizes a social media platform of concern or has an account with a social media platform of concern shall deactivate and delete such account and shall no longer use the social media platform.
- (c) The chief information technology officers of the executive, legislative and judicial branches of government shall cooperate to ensure that no social media platform of concern is being accessed on an electronic device owned or issued by a state agency or on a network operated by the state.
- (d) The provisions of this section shall not apply to state agencies that are using an electronic device owned or issued to an employee by a state agency to access a social media platform of concern for the purposes of law enforcement activities or cybersecurity investigations.
  - (e) As used in this section:
- (1) "Social media platform of concern" means an application or website that is owned or controlled by TikTok, a subsidiary or a successor company to TikTok or a company directly or indirectly controlled by TikTok.
- 30 (2) "State agency" means any state office or officers, department, 31 board, commission, institution or bureau or any agency, division or unit thereof.
  - Sec. 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its publication in the statute book.
