AN ACT concerning retirement and pensions; relating to the Kansas police
 and firemen's retirement system; providing for membership affiliation
 for certain security officers of the department of corrections and certain
 law enforcement officers and employees of the Kansas department of
 wildlife and parks; establishing employee and employer contributions.

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Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Kansas:

8 Section 1. (a) On and after July 1, 2023, the department of corrections 9 shall be an eligible employer as defined in K.S.A. 74-4952, and 10 amendments thereto, and shall affiliate on July 1, 2023, with the Kansas 11 police and firemen's retirement system established under K.S.A. 74-4951 12 et seq., and amendments thereto. The department of corrections shall make 13 application for affiliation with such system in the manner provided by 14 K.S.A. 74-4954, and amendments thereto, to be effective on the July 1 next following application. The department of corrections shall affiliate for 15 16 membership in the system of such officers and employees for participating 17 service credit.

(b) The division of the budget and the governor shall include in the
budget and in the budget request for appropriations for personnel services
the amount required to satisfy the employer's obligation under this section
as certified by the board of trustees of the system and shall present the
same to the legislature for allowance and appropriation. Upon affiliation,
the department of corrections shall pay to the system a sum sufficient to
satisfy such obligations as certified by the board.

(c) The determination of retirement, death or disability benefits shall
be computed upon the basis of credited service, as used in K.S.A. 74-4951
et seq., and amendments thereto, but shall include only participating
service with the department of corrections, commencing on and after the
effective date of affiliation by the department of corrections with the
Kansas police and firemen's retirement system.

(d) In the case of a member who retires on or after July 1, 2023,
whose date of membership in the system is prior to July 1, 1993, and any
member who was in such member's membership waiting period on July 1,
1993, and whose date of membership in the system is on or after July 1,
1993, shall have such member's employer certify to the Kansas public
employees retirement system the number of hours of such member's sick

1 and annual leaves at the time of such member's transfer to the Kansas 2 police and firemen's retirement system. Upon the date of such member's 3 retirement from the Kansas public employees retirement system, such 4 member may use in the calculation of the member's retirement benefit, the 5 average highest annual compensation, as defined in K.S.A. 74-4902(9), 6 and amendments thereto, which shall include but not exceed compensation 7 for the number of sick and annual leave hours certified to the Kansas 8 public employees retirement system on the date of the member's transfer, 9 paid to such member for any four years of participating service preceding 10 the transfer to the Kansas police and firemen's retirement system, or the average highest annual salary, as defined in K.S.A. 74-4902(33), and 11 12 amendments thereto, paid to such member for any three years of 13 participating service preceding retirement or termination of employment, 14 whichever is greater.

15 (e) Any rights or benefits accruing to any security officer employed by the department of corrections prior to the effective date of affiliation 16 17 shall be determined pursuant to the provisions of K.S.A. 74-4901 et seq., 18 and amendments thereto. Any security officer who becomes a member 19 pursuant to this section, who has a vested retirement benefit pursuant to 20 K.S.A. 74-4917. and amendments thereto, and who terminates 21 employment prior to attaining a vested benefit pursuant to K.S.A. 74-4963, 22 and amendments thereto, may have such service credited for purposes of 23 computing retirement benefits pursuant to K.S.A. 74-4901 et seq., and 24 amendments thereto. Notwithstanding any provision of K.S.A. 74-4901 et 25 seq., and amendments thereto, to the contrary, if a security officer has a vested retirement benefit pursuant to K.S.A. 74-4963, and amendments 26 27 thereto, and a vested retirement benefit pursuant to K.S.A. 74-4917, and 28 amendments thereto, and retires on or after such security officer's normal 29 retirement date under K.S.A. 74-4957a, and amendments thereto, then 30 such security officer shall also be deemed to have retired for the purposes 31 of K.S.A. 74-4901 et seq., and amendments thereto, and shall be eligible 32 for such vested retirement benefit pursuant to K.S.A. 74-4917, and 33 amendments thereto.

(f) Every person who is employed as a security officer on or after the
entry date of the department of corrections into the Kansas police and
firemen's retirement system shall become a member of the Kansas police
and firemen's retirement system.

(g) Except as otherwise provided by this act, any security officer
employed by the department of corrections who becomes a member of the
Kansas police and firemen's retirement system shall be subject to the
provisions of K.S.A. 74-4951 through 74-4970, and amendments thereto.

42 (h) Beginning with the first payment of compensation for services of 43 a security officer after becoming a member of the Kansas police and firemen's retirement system, the employer shall deduct from the
 compensation of such member 7.15% as the employee contribution to the
 system. Such deductions shall be remitted, deposited and credited as
 provided in K.S.A. 74-4965, and amendments thereto.

5 (i) As used in this section, "security officer" means any person, as 6 certified to the board by the secretary of corrections, who is employed on 7 or after the effective date of this act as an employee of the department of 8 corrections:

9 (1) Who is in any position in a job class in the corrections officer or 10 juvenile services corrections officer class series, including, but not limited to, corrections officer I (A), corrections officer I (B), corrections officer II, 11 12 corrections supervisor I, corrections supervisor II, corrections supervisor 13 III, corrections counselor I, corrections counselor II, unit team supervisor, 14 corrections classification administrator, juvenile corrections officer I (A), 15 juvenile corrections officer I (B), captain, major, juvenile corrections 16 officer II, juvenile corrections officer III, special investigator II, unit team 17 manager, chief of security, EAI investigator or EAI investigator supervisor job class, as all such job classes are described on July 1, 2023, in the state 18 19 job classification plan in effect for the classified service under the Kansas 20 civil service act or who is in a position in any successor job class or classes 21 that have been approved under K.S.A. 75-2938, and amendments thereto, 22 and who have substantially the same duties and responsibilities thereof;

23 (2) who is promoted prior to or on or after July 1, 2023, from a 24 position in any job class under paragraph (1) to any position in any job 25 class of warden or deputy warden of any correctional institution, training 26 program manager. training technician. superintendent. deputy 27 superintendent, corrections manager I, corrections manager II, staff 28 development specialist, safety and health inspector or safety and health 29 specialist, as such job classes are described on July 1, 2023, in the state job 30 classification plan in effect for the classified service under the Kansas civil 31 service act or to any successor job class or classes that are approved under 32 K.S.A. 75-2938, and amendments thereto, and who have substantially the 33 same duties and responsibilities, if the person was employed and had at 34 least three consecutive years of service in any one or more positions in any 35 one or more job classes described in paragraph (1) immediately preceding promotion to the position in a job class under this paragraph and is located 36 37 at a correctional institution or a juvenile correctional facility;

(3) who is in any position for which the duties and responsibilities
directly and primarily involve operation of power plant facilities within
any correctional institution or juvenile correctional facility and involve
regular contact with inmates or juvenile offenders;

42 (4) who is in any position for which the duties and responsibilities43 directly and primarily involve the operation of the correctional industries

activity of the department of corrections within a correctional institution or
 juvenile correctional facility and involve regular contact with inmates or
 juvenile offenders;

4 (5) who is in any position for which the duties and responsibilities 5 directly and primarily involve supervision of food service or laundry 6 operations within any correctional institution or juvenile correctional 7 facility and involve regular contact with inmates or juvenile offenders; or

8 (6) who is in any position for which the duties and responsibilities 9 directly and primarily involve supervision of maintenance operations 10 within any correctional institution or juvenile correctional facility and 11 involve regular contact with inmates or juvenile offenders.

(j) As used in this section, references to the department of corrections
 include correctional institutions as defined by K.S.A. 75-5202, and
 amendments thereto, and juvenile correctional facilities as defined by
 K.S.A. 38-2302, and amendments thereto, unless the context requires
 otherwise.

17 Sec. 2. (a) (1) On July 1, 2023, the Kansas department of wildlife and 18 parks shall be an eligible employer as defined in K.S.A. 74-4952, and 19 amendments thereto, and shall affiliate with the Kansas police and 20 firemen's retirement system established under the provisions of K.S.A. 74-21 4951 et seq., and amendments thereto, pursuant to the provisions of this 22 section for membership in the system of officers and employees employed 23 by the Kansas department of wildlife and parks who have successfully 24 completed the required course of instruction for law enforcement officers 25 approved by the Kansas law enforcement training center and are certified as a full-time police officer or law enforcement officer pursuant to the 26 27 provisions of K.S.A. 74-5607a, and amendments thereto, and who are 28 employed in the parks, public lands or law enforcement division. For 29 purposes of such affiliation for membership in the system of such 30 members, the Kansas department of wildlife and parks shall be considered 31 a new participating employer. The Kansas department of wildlife and 32 parks shall make application for affiliation with such system in the manner 33 provided by K.S.A. 74-4954, and amendments thereto, to be effective on 34 the July 1 next following application. The Kansas department of wildlife 35 and parks shall affiliate for membership in the system of such officers and 36 employees for participating service credit.

(2) The Kansas department of wildlife and parks shall appropriate
and pay a sum sufficient to satisfy any obligations as certified by the board
of trustees of the retirement system based on an actuarial valuation of the
cost of such affiliation, and the employer contributions of the Kansas
department of wildlife and parks shall be as provided in K.S.A. 744967(1), and amendments thereto.

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(b) Each such officer and employee who is employed by the Kansas

department of wildlife and parks on or after the entry date of the Kansas
 department of wildlife and parks into the Kansas police and firemen's
 retirement system as provided in this section shall become a member of
 the Kansas police and firemen's retirement system on the first day of such
 employment and shall be subject to the provisions of K.S.A. 74-4951 et
 seq., and amendments thereto, as applicable.

7 (c) The division of the budget and the governor shall include in the 8 budget and in the budget request for appropriations for personnel services 9 the amount required to satisfy the employer's obligation under this section 10 as certified by the board of trustees of the system, and shall present the 11 same to the legislature for allowance and appropriation.

(d) The determination of retirement, death or disability benefits shall
be computed upon the basis of credited services, as used in K.S.A. 744951 et seq., and amendments thereto, but shall include only participating
service with the Kansas department of wildlife and parks, commencing on
and after the effective date of affiliation by the Kansas department of
wildlife and parks with the Kansas police and firemen's retirement system.

18 (e) In the case of a member who retires on or after July 1, 2023, 19 whose date of membership in the system is prior to July 1, 1993, and any 20 member who was in such member's membership waiting period on July 1, 21 1993, and whose date of membership in the system is on or after July 1, 22 1993, shall have such member's employer certify to the Kansas public 23 employees retirement system the number of hours of such member's sick 24 and annual leaves at the time of such member's transfer to the Kansas 25 police and firemen's retirement system. Upon the date of such member's 26 retirement from the Kansas public employees retirement system, such 27 member may use in the calculation of the member's retirement benefit, the 28 average highest annual compensation, as defined in K.S.A. 74-4902(9), 29 and amendments thereto, which shall include but not exceed compensation 30 for the number of sick and annual leave hours certified to the Kansas 31 public employees retirement system on the date of the member's transfer, 32 paid to such member for any four years of participating service preceding 33 the transfer to the Kansas police and firemen's retirement system, or the 34 average highest annual salary, as defined in K.S.A. 74-4902(33), and 35 amendments thereto, paid to such member for any three years of 36 participating service preceding retirement or termination of employment, 37 whichever is greater.

(f) Any rights or benefits accruing to any such officer or employee
employed by the Kansas department of wildlife and parks prior to the
effective date of affiliation shall be determined pursuant to the provisions
of K.S.A. 74-4901 et seq., and amendments thereto. Any officer and
employee who becomes a member pursuant to this section, who has a
vested retirement benefit pursuant to K.S.A. 74-4917, and amendments

thereto, and who terminates employment prior to attaining a vested benefit
 pursuant to K.S.A. 74-4963, and amendments thereto, may have such
 service credited for purposes of computing retirement benefits pursuant to
 K.S.A. 74-4901 et seq., and amendments thereto.

5 (g) Beginning with the first payment of compensation for services of 6 such officer or employee after becoming a member of the Kansas police 7 and firemen's retirement system, the employer shall deduct from the 7 compensation of such member 7.15% as the employee contribution to the 8 system. Such deductions shall be remitted, deposited and credited as 10 provided in K.S.A. 74-4965, and amendments thereto.

11 Sec. 3. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its 12 publication in the statute book.
