## SENATE BILL No. 324

AN ACT concerning cities and counties; relating to grants; creating the legislative help grant fund; providing for transfers to and distributions from such fund; establishing help counties grants, state representative help grants and state senator help grants; prescribing procedures, requirements and limitations for such grants.

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*Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Kansas:* 

Section 1. (a) There is hereby created in the state treasury the legislative help grant fund. Such fund shall be administered by the state treasurer subject to the provisions of this section. All expenditures from the legislative help grant fund shall be made in accordance with appropriation acts upon warrants of the director of accounts and reports issued pursuant to vouchers approved by the state treasurer or the state treasurer's designee. All expenditures from the legislative help grant fund shall be for the purpose of providing:

- (1) Help counties grants;
- (2) state representative help grants; and
- (3) state senator help grants.
- (b) On July 1, 2023, or as soon thereafter as moneys are available, the director of accounts and reports shall transfer \$400,000,000 from the state general fund to the legislative help grant fund.
- (c) The state treasurer shall forward a help counties grant application to any county that requests such application and provides certification to the state treasurer that such county has complied with the provisions of K.S.A. 2022 Supp. 79-2988, and amendments thereto, for the ensuing budget year. Such certification shall be signed by the board of county commissioners of such county. The department of administration shall verify such county's compliance with the provisions of K.S.A. 2022 Supp. 79-2988, and amendments thereto, for the ensuing budget year and shall certify such county's compliance to the state treasurer.
- (d) Once a help counties grant application is received by the state treasurer, the state treasurer shall notify all members of the legislature that represent the applying county or a portion thereof and provide grant acknowledgment forms to such members of the legislature. All such members of the legislature shall sign and transmit to the state treasurer such forms acknowledging the grant and the use of grant moneys. Upon

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receipt of all such forms, the state treasurer shall pay from the legislative help grant fund the amount of such help counties grant to the appropriate fund of the county. The state treasurer shall transmit a copy of certification of each payment from the legislative help grant fund to the director of the budget and the director of legislative research.

- (e) A single county shall not receive an aggregate amount of help counties grants exceeding:
  - (1) \$100,000 for a county with a population of less than 10,000;
- (2) \$200,000 for any county with a population of 10,000 or more but less than 50,000;
- (3) \$500,000 for any county with a population of 50,000 or more but less than 500,000; and
  - (4) \$3,000,000 for any county with a population of 500,000 or more.
- (f) (1) The state treasurer shall make available from the legislative help grant fund state representative help grants in an amount not to exceed \$125,000 for every state representative district in which any city or county has adopted a revenue neutral rate budget in accordance with K.S.A. 2022 Supp. 79-2988, and amendments thereto, for the ensuing budget year.
- (2) The state treasurer shall forward a state representative help grant application to any city or county that requests such application and provides certification to the state treasurer that such city or county has complied with the provisions of K.S.A. 2022 Supp. 79-2988, and amendments thereto, for the ensuing budget year. Such certification shall be signed by all members of the governing body of such city or county. The department of administration shall verify such city's or county's compliance with the provisions of K.S.A. 2022 Supp. 79-2988, and amendments thereto, for the ensuing budget year and shall certify such city's or county's compliance to the state treasurer.
- (3) The city or county shall provide a list of suggested projects to be funded by such grant and shall forward such list to the state representative representing the state representative district of such city or county described in paragraph (1). Such state representative shall recommend to the state treasurer the grant money that shall be awarded for any listed project and shall provide notice of such recommendation to the speaker of the house of representatives and the majority and minority leaders of the house of representatives. Upon receipt of such recommendation, the state treasurer shall pay from the legislative help grant fund the amount of such state representative help grant to the appropriate fund of the city or county. The state treasurer shall transmit a copy of certification of each payment from the legislative help grant fund to the director of the budget and the director of legislative research.
- (g) (1) The state treasurer shall make available from the legislative help grant fund state senator help grants in an amount not to exceed

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\$500,000 for every state senate district in which any city or county has adopted a revenue neutral rate budget in accordance with K.S.A. 2022 Supp. 79-2988, and amendments thereto, for the ensuing budget year.

- (2) The state treasurer shall forward a state senator help grant application to any city or county that requests such application and provides certification to the state treasurer that such city or county has complied with the provisions of K.S.A. 2022 Supp. 79-2988, and amendments thereto, for the ensuing budget year. Such certification shall be signed by all members of the governing body of such city or county. The department of administration shall verify such city's or county's compliance with the provisions of K.S.A. 2022 Supp. 79-2988, and amendments thereto, for the ensuing budget year and shall certify such city's or county's compliance to the state treasurer.
- (3) The city or county shall provide a list of suggested projects to be funded by such grant and shall forward such list to the state senator representing the state senate district of such city or county described in paragraph (1). Such state senator shall recommend to the state treasurer the grant money that shall be awarded for any listed project and shall provide notice of such recommendation to the president of the senate and the majority and minority leaders of the senate. Upon receipt of such recommendation, the state treasurer shall pay from the legislative help grant fund the amount of such state senator help grant to the appropriate fund of the city or county. The state treasurer shall transmit a copy of certification of each payment from the legislative help grant fund to the director of the budget and the director of legislative research.
  - (h) All grants provided under this section shall be used only:
  - (1) For one-time infrastructure or capital expenditures; and
  - (2) in the budget where property tax is customarily used.
  - (i) No grant provided under this section shall be used for any:
- (1) Salaries, wages, benefits or other ongoing or recurring costs, including, but not limited to, utility costs;
  - (2) bond payments; or
- 33 (3) lease payments.
- Sec. 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its publication in the statute book.
