3 (c) In investing and reinvesting moneys specified in subsection (a) 4 and in acquiring, retaining, managing and disposing of investments of the 5 moneys, the board of trustees shall exercise the judgment, care, skill, 6 prudence and diligence under the circumstances then prevailing, which 7 persons of prudence, discretion and intelligence acting in a like capacity 8 and familiar with such matters would use in the conduct of an enterprise of like character and with like aims by diversifying the investments of the 9 moneys so as to minimize the risk of large losses, unless under the 10 circumstances it is clearly prudent not to do so, and not in regard to 11 speculation but in regard to the permanent disposition of similar moneys, 12 13 considering the probable income as well as the probable safety of their 14 capital.

15 (d) In the discharge of such management and investment 16 responsibilities the board of trustees may contract for the services of one 17 or more professional investment advisors or other consultants in the management and investment of such moneys and otherwise in the 18 19 performance of the duties of the board of trustees under this section.

20 (e) The board of trustees shall require that each person contracted 21 with under subsection (d) to provide services shall obtain commercial 22 insurance that provides for errors and omissions coverage for such person 23 in an amount to be specified by the board of trustees. legislature to apply for and receive federal grants during fiscal year 2024 1 2 and 2025: Provided, That federal grants are hereby authorized to be 3 applied for and received by such state agencies that concern moneys from 4 the federal government subject to the following provisions: Provided 5 *further*, That except as provided further, no expenditure shall be made from 6 and no obligation shall be incurred against any such federal grant or other 7 federal receipt during fiscal year 2024 and 2025 that has not been 8 previously appropriated, reappropriated or approved for expenditure by the 9 legislature until the legislature expressly consents to and approves such appropriation or expenditure by an act of the legislature: Provided 10 11 however, That if such federal grant or receipt is a part of a continuing, 12 existing state program that was previously appropriated, reappropriated or approved for expenditure by the legislature in fiscal year 2023 for such 13 14 agency, then during fiscal year 2024 and 2025, such agency is authorized 15 to expend all approved moneys lawfully credited to and available in such 16 fund or funds during fiscal year 2024 and 2025: Provided however, That 17 such authorization shall not exceed \$10,000,000 during fiscal year 2024 or 18 2025: And provided further, That during fiscal year 2024 and 2025, any 19 agency that is expending moneys as a continuing, existing program that 20 was previously appropriated, reappropriated or approved for expenditure 21 by the legislature in fiscal year 2023 shall submit a report to the senate 22 committee on ways and means and the house of representatives committee 23 on appropriations within 30 days of receipt of the federal grant or other 24 federal receipt detailing the continuing, existing program, the citation to 25 the previously appropriated, reappropriated or approved for expenditure 26 authorization by the legislature, the total amount of such grant or receipt 27 and the proposed expenditures from such grant or receipt.

Sec. 199. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after itspublication in the Kansas register.
