AN ACT concerning elections; amending K.S.A. 2010 Supp. 25-205 1 2 and repealing the existing section. 3 4 Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Kansas: 5 Section 1. K.S.A. 2010 Supp. 25-205 is hereby amended to read as 6 follows: 25-205. (a) Except as otherwise provided in this section, the 7 names of candidates for national, state, county and township offices 8 shall be printed upon the official primary ballot when each shall have 9 qualified to become a candidate by one of the following methods and 10 none other: (1) They shall have had filed in their behalf, not later than 11 12:0012 noon, June 10, prior to such primary election, or if such date 12 falls on Saturday, Sunday or a holiday, then before 12:0012 noon of the 13 next following day that is not a Saturday. Sunday or a holiday, 14 nomination petitions, as provided for in this act, except that in 1998, 15 eandidates for judge or district magistrate judge of the district court for 16 positions created in 1998 in those judicial districts that have not-17 approved the proposition of nonpartisan selection of judges of the-18 district court shall have filed in their behalf, not later than 12:00 noon, 19 July 1, 1998, nomination petitions, as provided for in this act; or (2) 20 they shall have filed not later than the time for filing nomination 21 petitions, as above provided, with the proper officer a declaration of 22 intention to become a candidate, accompanied by the fee required by 23 law. Such declaration shall be prescribed by the secretary of state. 24 Nomination petitions shall be in substantially the following (b) 25 form: 26 I, the undersigned, an elector of the county of __, and 27 state of Kansas, and a duly registered voter, and a member of 28 party, hereby nominate _, who 29 resides in the township of (or at number on ______street, city of ______), in the county of 30 ____ and state of Kansas, as a candidate for the office of 31 32 (here specify the office) _____, to be voted for at the primary election to be held on the first Tuesday in August in 33

1 , as representing the principles of such party; and I 2 further declare that I intend to support the candidate herein named and 3 that I have not signed and will not sign any nomination petition for any 4 other person, for such office at such primary election. 5 (HEADING) 6 Street Number Name of Name of Date of 7 or Rural Route Signers. City. Signing. 8 (as registered). 9 All nomination petitions shall have substantially the foregoing form, 10 written or printed at the top thereof. No signature shall be counted unless it is upon a sheet having such written or printed form at the top 11 12 thereof. 13 (c) Each signer of a nomination petition shall sign but one such 14 petition for the same office, and shall declare that such person intends 15 to support the candidate therein named, and shall add to such person's signature and residence, if in a city, by street and number (if any); or, 16 17 otherwise by post-office address. No signature shall be counted unless the place of residence of the signer is clearly indicated and the date of 18 19 signing given as herein required and if ditto marks are used to indicate 20 address they shall be continuous and clearly made. Such sheets shall 21 not be cut or pasted together. 22 (d) All signers of each separate nomination petition shall reside in 23 the same county and election district of the office sought. The affidavit described in this paragraph of a petition circulator who is a resident of 24 25 the state of Kansas and has the qualifications of an elector in the state 26 of Kansas or of the candidate shall be appended to each petition and 27 shall contain, at the end of each set of documents carried by each 28 circulator, a verification, signed by the circulator or the candidate, to 29 the effect that such circulator or the candidate personally witnessed the 30 signing of the petition by each person whose name appears thereon. 31 (e) Except as otherwise provided in subsection (g), nomination 32 petitions shall be signed: 33 (1) If for a state officer elected on a statewide basis or for the 34 office of United States senator, by voters equal in number to not less 35 than 1% of the total of the current voter registration of the party 36 designated in the state as compiled by the office of the secretary of

(2) if for a state or national officer elected on less than a statewide
basis, by voters equal in number to not less than 2% of the total of the

current voter registration of the party designated in such district as
 compiled by the office of the secretary of state, except that for the
 office of district magistrate judge, by not less than 2% of the total of the
 current voter registration of the party designated in the county in which
 such office is to be filled as certified to the secretary of state in
 accordance with K.S.A. 25-3302, and amendments thereto;

(3) if for a county office, by voters equal in number to not less
than 3% of the total of the current voter registration of the party
designated in such district or county as compiled by the county election
officer and certified to the secretary of state in accordance with K.S.A.
25-3302, and amendments thereto; and

(4) if for a township office, by voters equal in number to not less
than 3% of the total of the current voter registration of the party
designated in such township as compiled by the county election officer
and certified to the secretary of state in accordance with K.S.A. 253302, and amendments thereto.

17 (f) Subject to the requirements of K.S.A. 25-202, and amendments 18 thereto, any political organization filing nomination petitions for a 19 majority of the state or county offices, as provided in this act, shall 20 have a separate primary election ballot as a political party and, upon 21 receipt of such nomination petitions, the respective officers shall 22 prepare a separate state and county ballot for such new party in their 23 respective counties or districts thereof in the same manner as is 24 provided for existing parties.

(g) In any year in which districts are reapportioned for the offices
of representative in the United States congress, senator and
representative in the legislature of the state of Kansas or member of the
state board of education:

(1) If new boundary lines are defined and districts established in the manner prescribed by law on or before May 10, nomination petitions for nomination to such offices shall be signed by voters equal in number to not less than 1% of the total of the current voter registration of the party designated in the district as compiled by the office of the secretary of state.

(2) If new boundary lines are defined and districts established in
the manner prescribed by law on or after May 11, nomination petitions
for nomination to the following offices shall be signed by registered
voters of the party designated in the district equal in number to not less

(2) If new boundary lines are defined and districts established in 20 21 the manner prescribed by law on or after JuneMay 11, the deadline for 22 filing nomination petitions and declarations of intention to become a 23 candidate for such office, accompanied by the fee required by law, shall 24 be 12:0012 noon on July 12 June 18, or if such date falls on a Saturday, 25 Sunday or holiday, then before 12:0012 noon of the next day that is not 26 a Saturday, Sunday or holiday. 27 Sec. 2. K.S.A. 2010 Supp. 25-205 is hereby repealed.
