SUBJECT: Fiscal Note for SB 74 by Senate Committee on Commerce

In accordance with KSA 75-3715a, the following fiscal note concerning SB 74 is respectfully submitted to your committee.

SB 74 would amend the Prison-Made Goods Act by prohibiting the Department of Corrections from establishing or maintaining a home building program which produces manufactured or modular homes and which would compete with private manufacturers and dealers of manufactured or modular homes.

According to the Department of Corrections, passage of SB 74 would have no fiscal effect. However, the bill could result in reduced trade skills for offenders.
