1 AN ACT concerning the board of cosmetology; relating to licensure and 2 renewal; amending K.S.A. 65-1904a and repealing the existing section.

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4 Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Kansas:

5 Section 1. K.S.A. 65-1904a is hereby amended to read as follows: 65-6 1904a. (a) Any licensed cosmetologist, esthetician, electrologist, 7 manicurist, or person desiring to establish a salon or clinic shall make 8 application, on a form provided, to the Kansas state board of cosmetology, 9 accompanied by the new salon or clinic license fee established under K.S.A. 65-1904, and amendments thereto. Upon filing of the application, 10 the board shall inspect the equipment as to safety and sanitary condition of 11 12 the premises and if the equipment and premises are found to comply with 13 the rules and regulations of the secretary of health and environment and 14 the rules and regulations of the Kansas state board of cosmetology, the 15 board shall issue a new salon or clinic license.

16 (b) Nothing herein contained shall be construed as preventing any 17 licensed cosmetologist, manicurist, esthetician or electrologist from 18 practicing in the field for which licensed in such licensee's private home or 19 residence if the home or residence complies with rules and regulations of 20 the secretary and the state board. A licensed cosmetologist, manicurist, 21 esthetician or electrologist may provide services in the field in which 22 licensed in a place other than the licensed salon or clinic or a private home 23 or residence of the licensed cosmetologist, manicurist, esthetician or 24 electrologist. Excluding services provided by a licensed cosmetologist, 25 manicurist, esthetician or electrologist in a health care facility, hospital or 26 nursing home or in the residence of a person requiring home care arising 27 from physical or mental disabilities, in order to provide such services, such 28 licensed cosmetologist, manicurist, esthetician or electrologist shall be 29 employed in a salon or clinic or in the licensed cosmetologist's, 30 manicurist's, esthetician's or electrologist's private home or residence for at 31 least 51% of the total hours per week employed; and shall attest by 32 affidavit that such cosmetology, manicuring, esthetics or electrology 33 services shall be provided only in the residence or office of the person 34 receiving services.

35 (c) Licensed salons and clinics may be reinspected in accordance with 36 a schedule determined by the board by rules and regulations or upon a

complaint made to the board that such salon or clinic is not being 1 maintained in compliance with rules and regulations of the board. The 2 license shall expire on June 30 following its issuance. Any such license 3 may be renewed upon application accompanied by the salon or clinic-4 license renewal fee made to the board before July 1 of the year in which 5 6 the license expires The license shall expire one year from the last day of 7 the month of its issuance. Any such license may be renewed upon application accompanied by the salon or clinic license renewal fee made 8 9 to the board prior to the expiration date of the license. Any license may be renewed by the applicant within 60 days after the date of expiration of the 10 last license upon payment of-a the annual renewal fee plus the delinquent 11 12 renewal fee 13 (d) On or after July 1, 2013, salon and clinic renewal application

- 14 fees will be prorated to reflect an expiration date one year from the last 15 day of the month of the initial issuance of the license.
- 16 Sec. 2. K.S.A. 65-1904a is hereby repealed.
- Sec. 3. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after itspublication in the statute book.
