SUPPLEMENTAL NOTE ON HOUSE BILL NO. 2147

As Recommended by House Committee on <u>Transportation</u>

Brief*

HB 2147 would repeal 15 outdated statutes related to roads and bridges.

The statutes that would be repealed require highway signs that list distances to include metric system distances if a U.S. Department of Transportation demonstration project was approved; require heavy planks over certain bridges, culverts, and crosswalks when moving certain types of heavy equipment; and authorize construction of bridges over the Missouri River and contain requirements for those bridges.

Background

The Kansas Department of Transportation provided written testimony in support of the bill. There was no other testimony.

The statutes to be repealed were enacted and amended in 1917 through 1977; the more recent amendments were technical in nature.

According to the fiscal note prepared by the Division of the Budget, the bill would have no fiscal effect.
