2014 Kansas Statutes

59-3502. Same; filing of form with register of deeds. An interest in real estate is titled in transfer-ondeath form by executing, acknowledging and recording in the office of the register of deeds in the county where the real estate is located, prior to the death of the owner, a deed in substantially the following form:

<u>(Name of owner)</u> as owner transfers on death to <u>(name of beneficiary)</u>, as grantee beneficiary, the following described interest in real estate: (here insert description of the interest in real estate). THIS TRANSFER ON DEATH DEED IS REVOCABLE. IT DOES NOT TRANSFER ANY OWNERSHIP UNTIL THE DEATH OF THE OWNER. IT REVOKES ALL PRIOR BENEFICIARY DESIGNATIONS BY THIS OWNER FOR THIS INTEREST IN REAL ESTATE.

Instead of the words "transfer-on-death" the abbreviation "TOD" may be used.
