**SUBJECT:** Fiscal Note for HB 2297 by House Committee on Transportation

In accordance with KSA 75-3715a, the following fiscal note concerning HB 2297 is respectfully submitted to your committee.

HB 2297 would allow any person issued a Purple Heart or Vietnam War Veteran license plate to request a decal for each of the special plates by submitting proof to the Director of Vehicles that the individual was awarded a Vietnam Service Medal.

The Department of Revenue estimates that HB 2297 could increase revenues to the Division of Vehicles Operating Fund by \$8,000 in FY 2016 if all 4,000 individuals currently issued a Purple Heart or Vietnam War Veteran license plate were to request a decal and pay the \$2 fee (4,000 x \$2 = \$8,000). The Department estimates the costs associated with issuing the new decal would increase expenditures by \$720 in FY 2016 which could be absorbed within existing resources. Any fiscal effect associated with HB 2297 is not reflected in *The FY 2016 Governor's Budget Report*.
