1 AN ACT concerning the dispensing of alcoholic liquor.

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3 *Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Kansas:*

4 Section 1. For purposes of sections 1 and 2, and amendments thereto,
5 the following terms shall have the meanings specified in this section:

6 (a) "Dispense" means to portion out servings of alcoholic liquor for
7 consumption. This term shall include the pouring of drinks of alcoholic
8 liquor and opening original containers of alcoholic liquor for consumption
9 by consumers; and

10 (b) "infuse" means to add flavor or scent to a liquid by steeping
11 additional ingredients in the liquid.

12 Sec. 2. (a) Alcoholic liquor shall be dispensed only from original
13 containers, except any drinking establishment licensee or its agent or
14 employee, may dispense:

15 (1) Alcoholic liquor from a machine or container used to mix
16 alcoholic liquor with other liquids or solids intended for human
17 consumption;

18 (2) alcoholic liquor from a machine or container used to chill
19 alcoholic liquor, which may contain additional liquids or solids intended
20 for human consumption; or

21 (3) infused alcoholic liquor from a container used to infuse alcoholic
22 liquor with other substances intended for human consumption.

23 (b) A drinking establishment licensee, or its agent or employee, shall
24 not refill any original container with any alcoholic liquor or any other
25 substance.

26 (c) Any drinking establishment licensee, or its agent or employee,
27 may infuse alcoholic liquor with spices, herbs, fruits, vegetables, candy or
28 other substances intended for human consumption if no additional
29 fermentation occurs during the process.

30 Sec. 3. A caterer shall provide electronic notification to the director
31 prior to any event at which the caterer will sell alcoholic liquor by the
32 individual drink. The director shall make the electronic notification
33 available to local law enforcement. Notice shall consist of the time,
34 location and the names of the contracting parties of the event. For events
35 where alcohol is served, a licensee shall retain all documents for a period
36 of three years for inspection by the director. The documents retained shall

1 include agreements, receipts, employees assigned to the event and records
2 of alcohol purchased.

3 Sec. 4. Sections 1 and 2, and amendments thereto, shall be a part of
4 and supplemental to the club and drinking establishment act.

5 Sec. 5. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its
6 publication in the statute book.
