Hello, my name is Jacob Pellegrino and I am currently attending the University of Kansas where I am a Senior, full-time student, pro-Israel activist and leader within the pro-Israel movement on my campus. My relationship with Israel is nuanced, challenging, and most of all ever-growing.

It has never been my intention to push upon my community the same belief and passion for Israel that I have, although this is often the case. Instead, I do commit myself to educating my peers and empowering them to form their own opinions. I only believe this to be possible however, when tough conversations are being had absent biases and representative of clear and open dialogue. The BDS movement represents just the opposite. This acronym stands for boycotts, divestment, and sanctions against the state of Israel. It is biased, it is misguiding, and it is an inhibitor to creating a dialogue that fairly and accurately articulates the complex narratives of this two-sided issue. Everybody should have the right to love and challenge Israel, this should be a choice, and opinions allowed to be formed, this can't happen at the hands of a BDS movement.

Since arriving on campus, I have seen the role and influence of Israel grow and leave its impact on students regardless of political views, religious beliefs, or any other chosen identifier. The University of Kansas, is a flagship institution of this state, it is not only a home for Israeli and Jewish students, but it is also the foundation upon which high levels of education and cultural understanding are built. The university maintains a series of study abroad programs ranging from innovative tech start-ups to archeological digs, a multitude of Jewish based organizations, multiple pro-Israel outlets, and a continually developing and campus-wide event that has come to be known as Israel week.
