#### Senate Committee on Ethics, Elections and Local Government Testimony on SB 37

#### Madam Chair and Members of the Committee:

Thank you for the opportunity to testify on Senate Bill 37. Today I am presenting you with information collected by our office since the proof of citizenship requirement went into effect on January 1, 2013.

This information has come to our office in multiple ways, via phone, mail or in person. Most of this list was discovered because the individual is now a US citizen and when processing their new registration application and proof of citizenship document, it was discovered they were already in the voter registration database. I have attached a spreadsheet to this testimony that outlines each of the "cases" I am presenting to you.

During the last three years our office has been made aware of thirty two individuals who were not US citizens at the time of completing their registration application. Fourteen non-citizens successfully registered to vote prior to the proof of citizenship requirements, of those fourteen, five voted.

According to our records, here are the elections and the number of in-eligible ballots cast:

GN2004: 2 CG2005: 1 SP2007: 2 GN2008: 2 CP2009: 1 GN2010: 1 SPCW12: 1

In August of 2012 one in-eligible signature was accepted on a petition.

GN2012: 1 GN2014: 1

You will note by looking at this spreadsheet that in one case, it took almost twelve years for our office to discover that this registrant was not a citizen.

Another fifteen applicants submitted a voter registration application but were prevented from completing the process by the proof of citizenship requirement. The last three are registered

voters due to a preliminary injunction but were not citizens at the time they completed their original registration application.

This list is updated as new cases come to light, a new one was added just last Friday. Without having the ability to check our entire database, I have no way knowing how many more registrants may not be citizens.
