## HOUSE BILL No. 2006

1 AN ACT concerning counties; relating to the expansion of the board of 2 county commissioners; amending K.S.A. 2016 Supp. 19-203 and 3 repealing the existing section.

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5 Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Kansas:

6 Section 1. K.S.A. 2016 Supp. 19-203 is hereby amended to read as 7 follows: 19-203. (a) Subject to the provisions of K.S.A. 2016 Supp. 19-8 204b, and amendments thereto, when a vacancy occurs in the office of a 9 member of the board of county commissioners, it shall be filled by appointment of a resident in the district to fill the office for the unexpired 10 term and until a successor is elected and gualified. When a vacancy occurs 11 before May 1 of the first even-numbered year following the 12 commencement of a term of office, it shall be filled by the appointment of 13 a resident of such district who shall serve until a successor is elected and 14 15 qualified at the next general election. Such successor shall assume office on the second Monday of January next following such election. 16

17 (b) Except as provided by subsection (c), Appointments under this 18 section shall be made in the manner provided by K.S.A. 25-3902, and 19 amendments thereto, for filling vacancies in district offices.

Subject to the provisions of K.S.A. 2016 Supp. 19-204b, and 20 (c) amendments thereto, vacancies created by an increase in the number of 21 22 county commissioner districts in a county pursuant to K.S.A. 19-204, and amendments thereto, shall be filled by appointment of the governor. The 23 24 governor shall make such appointments within 30 days of the date of the 25 adoption of the resolution dividing the county into commissioner districts 26 or within 30 days of the date of the order of the district court dividing the county into commissioner districts as required by K.S.A. 19-204a, and 27 28 amendments thereto. Such appointees at <u>a special</u> an election as provided 29 in subsection (d) section 2, and amendments thereto.

30 (d) Following the certification of the elections results expanding the

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1 board of county commissioners and the adoption of the resolution dividing

2 the county into commissioner districts as required by K.S.A. 19-204a, and

3 amendments thereto, the board of county commissioners shall pass a-

*resolution calling for a special election to fill the vacancies. The election shall be held within 45 days of the passage of the resolution. Candidates*

6 for the office shall file for the offices as provided in K.S.A. 25-205, and

7 amendments thereto. The candidate receiving the highest number of votes 8 in each commission district shall serve until successors are elected and 9 qualified at the next general election. Such successors shall assume office 10 on the second Monday of January next following their election. If at the next general election following-such appointments, the special election 11 more than a simple majority of commissioners are elected, persons elected 12 to the positions created by an increase in the number of districts shall be 13 elected for two year terms and until their successors are qualified. 14 Thereafter such members shall be elected to four year terms and until their 15 16 successors are qualified. The provisions of this subsection shall apply to 17 positions created by an increase in the number of districts at the election 18 held in November 1990 and all such elections thereafter.

19 New Sec. 2. (a) The governor, within five days of the {board of 20 county commissioners adopting a resolution dividing the county into 21 the number of districts approved by voters following the} election 22 expanding the size of the board of county commissioners as provided 23 in K.S.A. 19-204(c), and amendments thereto,-shall in consultation 24 with the board of county commissioners, shall either: (1) Declare the 25 election to be held at the next regularly scheduled-odd-numbered year *(general) election; or (2)* declare the date of the special election 26 required under K.S.A. 19-203(c), and amendments thereto. 27

If the decision is to call a special election, the vacancy election shall be on a day not less than 75 days nor more than 90 days from the date of the election approving the expansion of such county commission {board of county commissioners adopting such resolution}.

(b) The county chairperson of each political party that has
obtained official recognition shall call a convention for a date not less
than 15 days and not more than 25 days after the governor's
declaration. Such party shall nominate a candidate to fill the vacancy
{vacancies} that has {have} occurred due to the expansion of the size
of the board of county commissioners.

(c) Independent candidates may be nominated by petition of not
less than 5% of the qualified electors within the county commission
district. Any such petition shall be filed with the county election officer
within 25 days of the governor's declaration.
