Chairman Johnson and Members of the Committee:

Kansas Legislative Policy Group (KLPG) would like to thank you for the opportunity to provide testimony today on House Bill No. 2656. KLPG is a non-partisan organization comprised of elected commissioners representing the collective interests of 33 rural Kansas counties.

House Bill No. 2656 discontinues the apportionment of the countywide sales tax for general purposes to cities beginning on July 1, 2020. We oppose House Bill No. 2656.

We work cooperatively with our local government partners to develop relationships that benefit all the residents of our communities through a shared tax base. Passage of House Bill No. 2656 will unravel and divide these successful partnerships.

For years, we have been successfully operating under this tax sharing arrangement and we have had no complaints that this system has failed. This measure appears to be forcing a fix for one community where the working relationship is broken. In fact, the existing relationship may not be broken at all, but merely one party was unable to convince the other that their alternate distribution proposal was reasonable. Now they come to the legislature seeking to change the rules for everyone.

The effect of this legislation is far reaching and will create immediate fiscal impact to our city colleagues. In addition, local governments will be required to incur unnecessary cost and time delays by crafting interlocal agreements to continue doing what the law currently provides. There is no compelling reason for the legislature to change current law that is successfully working and ask that you oppose House Bill No. 2656.
