10	Section 1. K.S.A. 76-381 is hereby amended to read as follows: 76-	
11	381. As used in K.S.A. 76-380 through 76-386, and amendments thereto:	
12	(a) "Act" means the medical student loan act;	
13	(b) "approved postgraduate residency training program" means a	
14	residency training program in general pediatrics, general internal	
15	medicine, family medicine, family practice, emergency medicine,	
16	obstetrics and gynecology, general psychiatry, child psychiatry or	
17	fellowship training in geriatric medicine;	
18	(c) "service commitment area" means: (1) Any community within any	
19	county in Kansas other than Douglas, Johnson, Sedgwick, Shawnee or	
20	Wyandotte county; (2) any state medical care facility or institution; (3) any	
21	medical center operated by the veterans administration of the United	
22	States; (4) the full-time faculty of the university of Kansas school of	
23	medicine in family medicine, family practice, general psychiatry or child	
24	psychiatry if serving as full-time faculty as provided in K.S.A. 76-384(c),	
25	and amendments thereto; or (5) any community within Wyandotte county	
26	for purposes of any practice obligation under an agreement entered into by

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5 Sec. 2. K.S.A. 76-383 is hereby amended to read as follows: 76-383. 6 A medical student loan agreement entered into by the university of Kansas

7 school of medicine and an undergraduate student enrolled in or admitted to 8 the university of Kansas school of medicine in a course of instruction

9 leading to the degree of doctor of medicine for the purpose of receiving a

10 medical student loan under this act shall require that the person receiving 11 the loan:

(a) Complete the required course of instruction and receive the degree
 of doctor of medicine and apply for, enter and complete an approved
 postgraduate residency training program;

15 (b) apply for and obtain a license to practice medicine and surgery in 16 Kansas;

17 (c) except as otherwise provided in K.S.A. 76-384, and amendments 18 thereto, engage in the full-time practice of medicine and surgery for a 19 period of 12 months within a service commitment area, except as-20 otherwise provided in K.S.A. 76-384(c), and amendments thereto, for 21 service as a full-time faculty member of the university of Kansas school of 22 medicine in family medicine, family practice, general psychiatry or child 23 psychiatry;

(d) commence such full-time practice of medicine and surgery within
nine months after completion of an approved postgraduate residency
training program and licensure in a service commitment area and continue
such full-time practice in such service commitment area for a consecutive
period of months equal to the total number of months required under the
agreement;

(e) agree that the service commitment for each agreement entered into
under this act is in addition to the service commitment contained in any
other agreement which that has been or may be entered into under this act
for the purpose of obtaining a medical student loan or under other
agreements for the purpose of obtaining scholarship aid;

(f) maintain records and make reports to the university of Kansas school of medicine to document the satisfaction of the obligation under such agreement to engage in the full-time practice of medicine and surgery within a service commitment area and to continue such full-time practice in such service commitment area for a consecutive period of months equal to the total number of months required under the agreement; and

(g) upon failure to satisfy an agreement to engage in the full-time
 practice of medicine and surgery within a service commitment area for the
 required period of time under any such agreement, the person receiving a

medical student loan under this act shall repay amounts to the university of
 Kansas school of medicine as provided in K.S.A. 76-385, and amendments
 thereto.

Sec. 3. K.S.A. 76-385 is hereby amended to read as follows: 76-385. 4 (a) (1) Except as otherwise provided in paragraphs (2), (3), (4) and (5) 5 through (6) or in K.S.A. 76-386, and amendments thereto, upon the failure 6 7 of any person to satisfy the obligation to engage in the full-time practice of 8 medicine and surgery within a service commitment area of this state for the required period of time under any medical student loan agreement 9 entered into under this act, such person shall repay to the university of 10 Kansas school of medicine in accordance with subsection (b) an amount 11 equal to the total of: (A) The amount of money received by such person 12 pursuant to such agreement, or the amount of money determined under 13 rules and regulations of the university of Kansas; plus (B) annual interest 14 at a rate of 15% from the date such money was received. 15

(2) Any person who fails to apply for and enter an approved 16 postgraduate residency training program shall be required to repay all 17 moneys received pursuant to an agreement entered into for any such 18 medical student loan, plus accumulated interest at an annual rate of 15% 19 and shall commence such repayment in accordance with subsection (b) 20 within 90 days of graduation from the school of medicine or upon 21 22 termination or completion of a residency training program which does not 23 comply with the provisions of this act, whichever is later.

24 (3) If at any time a person is failing to satisfy an obligation to engage in the full-time practice of medicine and surgery in Kansas for the required 25 period of time under an agreement entered into under this act because such 26 person is engaged in the full-time practice of medicine and surgery in a 27 28 state other than Kansas, or within Kansas in an area that is not a service commitment area or in the practice of medicine and surgery which does 29 not otherwise comply with the agreement entered into under this act, and if 30 such person is subject to or currently making repayments under this 31 section and if such person subsequently commences the practice of 32 33 medicine and surgery in this state which is in a service commitment area or which otherwise complies with the agreement entered into under this 34 act, the balance of the repayment amount, including interest thereon, from 35 the time of such commencement of practice until the obligation of such 36 37 person is satisfied, or until the time such person again becomes subject to repayments, shall be waived. All repayment amounts due prior to such 38 commencement of practice, including interest thereon, shall continue to be 39 payable as provided in this section. If subsequent to such commencement 40 of practice, the person fails to satisfy such obligation, the person again 41 shall be subject to repayments, including interest thereon, as otherwise 42 provided in this section. 43

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(4) If, during the time a person is satisfying the service requirement 1 2 of an agreement entered into under this act, such person desires to engage in less than the full-time practice of medicine and surgery within a service 3 4 commitment area of the state and remain in satisfaction of such service requirement, such person may make application to the chancellor of the 5 6 university of Kansas or the designee of the chancellor for permission to 7 engage in less than such full-time practice of medicine and surgery. Upon a finding of exceptional circumstances made by the chancellor of the 8 university of Kansas, or the designee of the chancellor, such person may 9 be authorized to engage in less than the full-time practice of medicine and 10 surgery within a service commitment area of the state for the remaining 11 required period of time under such agreement and for an additional period 12 of time which shall be equal to the length of the originally required period 13 of time multiplied by the decimal fraction which is equal to the reduction 14 of the full-time practice of medicine and surgery to be authorized 15 hereunder, multiplied by two. In any such determination of the period 16 required to be engaged in the less than full-time practice of medicine and 17 surgery, the decimal fraction utilized shall not exceed 0.5 and any person 18 granted permission to engage in less than the full-time practice of 19 20 medicine and surgery in accordance with the provisions of this paragraph shall be required to engage in at least the half-time practice of medicine 21 22 and surgery. 23 (5) Any person who enters but fails to complete an approved postgraduate residency training program, or who enters and completes an 24 approved postgraduate residency training program but fails to satisfy the 25 obligation to engage in the full-time practice of medicine and surgery 26

within a service commitment area of this state for the required period of time shall be required to repay all money received pursuant to an agreement entered into under this act-a *for any such* medical student loan, plus accumulated interest at an annual rate of 15% and shall commence such repayment in accordance with subsection (b) within 90 days of failure to complete an approved postgraduate residency training program or 90 days of failure to commence qualifying practice, whichever occurs first.

(6) For any person who entered and completed an approved 34 postgraduate residency training program in obstetrics and gynecology, if 35 during the time such person is satisfying the service requirement of an 36 37 agreement entered into pursuant to this act, such person is employed by, provides services at or establishes any clinic or facility as such terms are 38 defined in K.S.A. 65-4a01, and amendments thereto, or performs or 39 induces, or attempts to perform or induce, an abortion, except in the case 40 of a medical emergency as defined in K.S.A. 65-6701, and amendments 41 thereto, such person shall be deemed to have failed to complete such 42 person's service requirement and shall be required to repay all money 43

or in the case of a pregnancy resulting from rape or incest,

received pursuant to an agreement entered into under this act for any such
 medical student loan, plus accumulated interest at an annual rate of 15%,
 and shall commence such repayment in accordance with subsection (b).

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4 (b) For any repayment requirement under this section, the person 5 shall repay an amount totaling the entire amount to be repaid under all 6 such agreements for which such obligations are not satisfied, including all 7 amounts of interest at the rate prescribed. The repayment shall be made in 8 not more than 10 equal annual installment payments.

(c) All installment payments under this section shall commence six 9 10 months after the date of the action or circumstance that causes the failure of the person to satisfy the obligations of such agreements, as determined 11 by the university of Kansas school of medicine based upon the 12 13 circumstances of each individual case. In all cases, if an installment payment becomes 91 days overdue, the entire amount outstanding shall 14 become immediately due and payable, including all amounts of interest at 15 the rate prescribed. 16

(d) The total repayment obligation imposed under all agreements 17 entered into under this act may be satisfied by the person who entered into 18 the agreements at any time prior to graduation from the university of 19 Kansas school of medicine by making a single lump-sum payment equal to 20 the total of: (1) The entire amount to be repaid under all such agreements 21 22 upon failure to satisfy the obligations under such agreements to practice in 23 Kansas; plus (2) all amounts of interest thereon at the rate prescribed to the 24 date of payment. 25

(e) The university of Kansas school of medicine shall remit all moneys received under this section to the state treasurer in accordance with the provisions of K.S.A. 75-4215, and amendments thereto. Upon receipt of each such remittance, the state treasurer shall deposit the entire amount in the state treasury to the credit of the medical loan repayment fund.

31 (f) There is hereby created in the state treasury the medical loan repayment fund. All expenditures from the medical loan repayment fund 32 33 shall be for medical student loans under the medical student loan act and 34 for the expenses of administration of the medical student loan act and shall be made in accordance with appropriation acts upon warrants of the 35 director of accounts and reports issued pursuant to vouchers approved by 36 the chancellor of the university of Kansas or by a person designated by the 37 chancellor, except that expenditures shall not be made from the medical 38 loan repayment fund for medical student loans for medical students who 39 intend to enter and complete an approved postgraduate residency training 40 program in obstetrics and gynecology, general psychiatry or child 41 psychiatry. On the effective date of this act, the director of accounts and 42 reports shall transfer all moneys in the medical scholarship and loan 43

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repayment fund to the medical loan repayment fund. On the effective date 2 of this act, all liabilities of the medical scholarship and loan repayment fund are hereby imposed on the medical loan repayment fund and the 3 4 medical scholarship and loan repayment fund is hereby abolished. Whenever the medical scholarship and loan repayment fund, or words of 5 6 like effect, is referred to or designated by any statute, contract or other 7 document, such reference or designation shall be deemed to apply to the medical loan repayment fund. 8

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(g) There is hereby established in the state treasury the psychiatry 9 medical loan repayment fund. All moneys credited to the psychiatry 10 medical loan repayment fund shall be expended only for medical student 11 loans for general psychiatry or child psychiatry students under the medical 12 student loan act and for the expenses of administration of the medical 13 student loan act associated with such students. All expenditures from the 14 psychiatry medical loan repayment fund shall be made in accordance with 15 appropriation acts upon warrants of the director of accounts and reports 16 issued pursuant to vouchers approved by the chancellor of the university of 17 Kansas or the chancellor's designee. 18

(h) There is hereby established in the state treasury the OBGYN 19 20 medical loan repayment fund. All moneys credited to the OBGYN medical loan repayment fund shall be expended only for medical student loans for 21 22 medical students who intend to enter and complete an approved 23 postgraduate residency training program in obstetrics and gynecology under the medical student loan act and for the expenses of administration 24 of the medical student loan act associated with such students. All 25 expenditures from the OBGYN medical loan repayment fund shall be made 26 in accordance with appropriation acts upon warrants of the director of 27 accounts and reports issued pursuant to vouchers approved by the 28 chancellor of the university of Kansas or the chancellor's designee. 29

(h) Notwithstanding any other provision of law to the contrary, no 30 moneys shall be transferred from the comprehensive grant program 31 account of the state board of regents to the medical loan repayment fund, 32 33 the OBGYN medical loan repayment fund or the psychiatry medical loan repayment fund or expended for any purposes related thereto. 34

Sec. 4. K.S.A. 76-387 is hereby amended to read as follows: 76-387. 35 (a) (1) There is hereby established the Kansas medical residency bridging 36 program at the university of Kansas school of medicine, which shall be 37 developed and implemented in order to provide encouragement, 38 opportunities and incentives for persons in primary care or mental health 39 40 eare to:

(A) Enter and complete medical residency training programs in 41 general pediatrics, general internal medicine, family medicine, family 42 practice, obstetrics and gynecology, general psychiatry or child psychiatry 43

1 that are operated by or affiliated with the university of Kansas school of 2 medicine or other such primary care or mental health care medical

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residency training program that is operated in Kansas and approved by the
 state board of healing arts; and a person under subsection (i) to

5 (B) locate their medical practice in rural Kansas communities upon 6 completion of such residency training.

7 (2) The Kansas medical residency bridging program shall be 8 administered by the institute for rural health care of the university of 9 Kansas school of medicine.

(b) Subject to the provisions of appropriation acts, the university of 10 Kansas school of medicine may enter into residency bridging loan 11 agreements, in accordance with the provisions of this section: (A) with any 12 person who has completed the first year of a primary care or mental health 13 care medical residency training program in general pediatrics, general 14 internal medicine, family medicine, family practice, obstetrics and 15 gynecology, general psychiatry or child psychiatry that is operated by or 16 affiliated with the university of Kansas school of medicine or other such 17 primary care or mental health care medical residency training program that 18 is operated in Kansas and approved by the state board of healing arts; and 19 (B) with a person under subsection (i). 20

(c) Subject to the provisions of appropriation acts, each person 21 entering into a residency bridging loan agreement under this section shall 22 23 receive a payment of \$5,000 each year of primary care or mental health eare medical residency training, or any part of a year of such training, after 24 the date that the residency bridging loan agreement is entered into by the 25 resident and the university of Kansas school of medicine and, upon 26 completion of the primary care or mental health care medical residency 27 28 training program, a payment of \$6,000.

(d) Each residency bridging loan agreement shall require that theperson receiving the loan:

31 (1) Complete the primary care or mental health care medical
 32 residency training program;

(2) engage in the full-time practice of medicine and surgery in any
 county in Kansas other than Douglas, Johnson, Sedgwick, Shawnee or
 Wyandotte for three years under a practice commitment agreement;

36 (3) commence such full-time practice of medicine and surgery within
37 90 days after completing the primary care or mental health care *medical*38 residency training program; and

(4) upon failure to satisfy the obligation to engage in the full-time practice of medicine and surgery in accordance with the provisions of the residency bridging loan agreement and this section, the person receiving the loan under this section shall repay to the university of Kansas school of medicine, within 90 days of such failure, the amount equal to the amount of money moneys received by such person from the university of Kansas
 school of medicine, less credits earned, under such agreement plus interest
 at the annual rate of 15% from the date such money was moneys were
 received.

5 (e) An obligation to engage in the practice of medicine and surgery in accordance with the provisions of a residency bridging loan agreement and this section shall be postponed during: (1) Any period of temporary medical disability during which the person obligated is unable to practice medicine and surgery because of such medical disability; or (2) any other period of postponement agreed to or determined in accordance with criteria agreed to in the practice commitment agreement.

12 (f) *Except as otherwise provided in subsection (g)*, an obligation to 13 engage in the practice of medicine and surgery in accordance with the 14 provisions of a residency bridging loan agreement and this section shall be 15 satisfied: (1) If the obligation to engage in the practice of medicine and 16 surgery in accordance with such agreement has been completed; (2) if the 17 person obligated dies; or (3) if, because of permanent physical disability, 18 the person obligated is unable to practice medicine and surgery.

(g) For any person that completed a medical residency training 19 program in obstetrics and gynecology pursuant to this section, such 20 person's obligation to engage in the practice of medicine and surgery in 21 22 accordance with the provisions of a residency bridging loan agreement 23 and this section shall be deemed to not be satisfied if such person is employed by, provides services at or establishes any clinic or facility as 24 25 such terms are defined in K.S.A. 65-4a01, and amendments thereto, or performs or induces, or attempts to perform or induce, an abortion, except 26 in the case of a medical emergency as defined in K.S.A. 65-6701, and 27 amendments thereto, at any time in which such person is obligated to 28

satisfy the provisions of such person's loan agreement made pursuant tothis section.

31 (g)(h) The university of Kansas school of medicine may adopt 32 additional provisions, requirements or conditions for participation in the 33 Kansas medical residency bridging program as are practicable and 34 appropriate to accomplish the purposes of the program or as may be 35 required for the implementation or administration of the program and, in 36 any case, as are not inconsistent with the provisions of this section or the 37 provisions of appropriation acts.

(h)(i) As used in this section, "practice commitment agreement"
 means an agreement to commence the full-time practice of medicine and
 surgery in a city located in any county in Kansas other than Douglas,
 Johnson, Sedgwick, Shawnee or Wyandotte county, that:

42 (1) Was entered into: (A) by a person in a primary care or mental 43 health care *medical* residency training program in general pediatrics, or in the case of a pregnancy resulting from rape or incest,

general internal medicine, family medicine, family practice, obstetrics and 1 2 gynecology, general psychiatry or child psychiatry, that is operated by or affiliated with the university of Kansas school of medicine or other such 3 primary care or mental health care medical residency training program that 4 5 is operated in Kansas and approved by the state board of healing arts; or 6 (B) by a person under subsection (i), with the city where such practice is to 7 commence or another contracting entity other than the university of 8 Kansas school of medicine that is representative of the interests of such 9 city: and (2) provides benefits to such person that have an aggregate monetary 10

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value equal to or greater than the aggregate amount of payments to such
 person from the university of Kansas school of medicine under a residency
 bridging loan agreement under this section.

(i) A person who graduated from the university of Kansas school of 14 medicine prior to July 1, 1992, who has completed the first year of a 15 primary care residency training program in family practice which is 16 operated outside the state of Kansas and who has entered into a practice 17 commitment agreement with the north central Kansas health care-18 19 foundation is eligible to enter into a residency bridging loan agreement-20 under this section. (i) Notwithstanding any other provision of law to the contrary, no 21

moneys appropriated for the Kansas medical residency bridging program at the university of Kansas school of medicine, except moneys appropriated to the *OBGYN medical residency bridging fund or the* rural health bridging psychiatry fund, shall be expended for residency bridging loan agreements for medical residents training in general psychiatry or child psychiatry.

(k) Subject to appropriations, the university of Kansas school of
 medicine shall enter into residency bridging loan agreements with three
 medical residents training in general psychiatry or child psychiatry.

(1) There is hereby established in the state treasury the rural health 31 bridging psychiatry fund. All moneys credited to the rural health bridging 32 33 psychiatry fund shall be used only for purposes related to residency bridging loan agreements for medical residents training in general 34 psychiatry or child psychiatry pursuant to K.S.A. 76-387, and amendments 35 thereto this section. All expenditures from the rural health bridging 36 psychiatry fund shall be made in accordance with appropriation acts upon 37 warrants of the director of accounts and reports issued pursuant to 38 vouchers approved by the chancellor of the university of Kansas or the 39 chancellor's designee. 40 41 (m) There is hereby established in the state treasury the OBGYN

(m) There is hereby established in the state treasury the OBGYN
 medical residency bridging fund. All moneys credited to the OBGYN
 medical residency bridging fund shall be used only for purposes related to

11 bridging program.

12 Sec. 5. K.S.A. 76-381, 76-383, 76-385, 76-386a and 76-387 are 13 hereby repealed.

14 Sec. 6. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its 15 publication in the statute book.
