SB No. 136 An Act concerning roads and highways; designating a bridge on US highway 77 as the SGT Kevin A. Gilbertson memorial bridge.

"The bridge is a symbol of strength, honor and respect and it becomes part of the families/fallen warrior's legacy and history. The bridge will pass the torch onto countless generations and show them who the fallen warrior was and their sacrifice to our nation." The bridge is a mechanism of healing. It will serve as a reminder of not only SGT. Gilbertson's sacrifice but of all our nations heroes that have given so much for their country.

The South Summit Bridge over the Arkansas River serves as the last bridge leaving Kansas into Oklahoma and the first bridge entering Kansas on US Highway 77 from Oklahoma, which is already a Blue Star Highway.
