SUBJECT: Fiscal Note for HB 2200 by House Committee on Health and Human Services

In accordance with KSA 75-3715a, the following fiscal note concerning HB 2200 is respectfully submitted to your committee.

HB 2200 would amend existing law to exempt hair threading from the practice of cosmetology. The bill would define “threading,” “electrologist,” and “instructor-in-training” and would require the Kansas Department of Health and Environment to develop a brochure containing information about infection control techniques appropriate for threading.

According to the Kansas Board of Cosmetology and the Kansas Department of Health and Environment, enactment of HB 2200 would result in both agencies using some staff time to develop the infection control brochure. However, the agencies indicate that costs related to the bill could be handled from existing resources. Any fiscal effect associated with HB 2200 is not reflected in *The FY 2020 Governor’s Budget Report*.
