## HOUSE BILL No. 2007

AN ACT concerning motor vehicles; relating to distinctive license plates;
 providing license plates for-retired current and veteran members of
 the United States army, navy, marine corps, air force and coast guard;
 amending K.S.A. 2018 Supp. 8-1,141 and 8-1,147 and repealing the
 existing sections.

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Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Kansas:

8 New Section 1. (a) On and after January 1, 2020, any owner or lessee 9 of one or more passenger vehicles, trucks of a gross weight of 20,000 10 pounds or less or motorcycles, who is a resident of Kansas, and who 11 submits satisfactory proof to the director of vehicles, in accordance with 12 rules and regulations adopted by the secretary of revenue, that such person 13 is a retired member of the United States army currently serving in the United States army or has separated from the United States army and 14 was honorably discharged or received a general discharge under 15 honorable conditions, upon compliance with the provisions of this 16 section, may be issued one distinctive license plate for each such 17 passenger vehicle, truck or motorcycle designating such person as a retired 18 19 member current member or veteran of the United States army. Such 20 license plates shall be issued for the same period of time as other license 21 plates upon proper registration and payment of the regular license fee as 22 provided in K.S.A. 8-143, and amendments thereto.

23 (b) Any person who is a retired member current member or veteran 24 of the United States army may make application for such distinctive 25 license plates, not less than 60 days prior to such person's renewal of 26 registration date, on a form prescribed and furnished by the director of 27 vehicles, and any applicant for the distinctive license plates shall furnish 28 the director with proof as the director shall require that the applicant is a 29 retired member current member or veteran of the United States army. 30 Application for the registration of a passenger vehicle, truck or motorcycle 31 and issuance of the license plates under this section shall be made by the 32 owner or lessee in a manner prescribed by the director of vehicles upon 33 forms furnished by the director.

34 (c) No registration or distinctive license plate issued under the35 authority of this section shall be transferable to any other person.

(d) Renewals of registration under this section shall be made

annually, upon payment of the fee prescribed in subsection (a), in the
 manner prescribed in K.S.A. 8-132(b), and amendments thereto. No
 renewal of registration shall be made to any applicant until such applicant
 has filed with the director a form as provided in subsection (b). If such
 form is not filed, the applicant shall be required to comply with K.S.A. 8 143, and amendments thereto, and return the distinctive license plates to
 the county treasurer of such person's residence.

8 (a) On and after January 1, 2020, any owner or lessee of New Sec. 2. 9 one or more passenger vehicles, trucks of a gross weight of 20,000 pounds 10 or less or motorcycles, who is a resident of Kansas, and who submits satisfactory proof to the director of vehicles, in accordance with rules and 11 12 regulations adopted by the secretary of revenue, that such person is-a-13 retired member of the United States navy currently serving in the United States navy or has separated from the United States navy and was 14 15 honorably discharged or received a general discharge under 16 honorable conditions, upon compliance with the provisions of this 17 section, may be issued one distinctive license plate for each such 18 passenger vehicle, truck or motorcycle designating such person as a retired 19 member current member or veteran of the United States navy. Such 20 license plates shall be issued for the same period of time as other license 21 plates upon proper registration and payment of the regular license fee as 22 provided in K.S.A. 8-143, and amendments thereto.

23 (b) Any person who is a retired member current member or veteran 24 of the United States navy may make application for such distinctive 25 license plates, not less than 60 days prior to such person's renewal of registration date, on a form prescribed and furnished by the director of 26 27 vehicles, and any applicant for the distinctive license plates shall furnish 28 the director with proof as the director shall require that the applicant is a retired member current member or veteran of the United States navy. 29 30 Application for the registration of a passenger vehicle, truck or motorcycle 31 and issuance of the license plates under this section shall be made by the 32 owner or lessee in a manner prescribed by the director of vehicles upon 33 forms furnished by the director.

34 (c) No registration or distinctive license plate issued under the35 authority of this section shall be transferable to any other person.

36 (d) Renewals of registration under this section shall be made 37 annually, upon payment of the fee prescribed in subsection (a), in the 38 manner prescribed in K.S.A. 8-132(b), and amendments thereto. No 39 renewal of registration shall be made to any applicant until such applicant 40 has filed with the director a form as provided in subsection (b). If such form is not filed, the applicant shall be required to comply with K.S.A. 8-41 42 143, and amendments thereto, and return the distinctive license plates to 43 the county treasurer of such person's residence.

1 New Sec. 3. (a) On and after January 1, 2020, any owner or lessee of 2 one or more passenger vehicles, trucks of a gross weight of 20,000 pounds 3 or less or motorcycles, who is a resident of Kansas, and who submits 4 satisfactory proof to the director of vehicles, in accordance with rules and 5 regulations adopted by the secretary of revenue, that such person is-a-6 retired member of the United States marine corps currently serving in the 7 United States marine corps or has separated from the United States 8 marine corps and was honorably discharged or received a general 9 discharge under honorable conditions, upon compliance with the 10 provisions of this section, may be issued one distinctive license plate for each such passenger vehicle, truck or motorcycle designating such person 11 12 as a-retired member current member or veteran of the United States 13 marine corps. Such license plates shall be issued for the same period of 14 time as other license plates upon proper registration and payment of the regular license fee as provided in K.S.A. 8-143, and amendments thereto. 15

16 (b) Any person who is a retired member current member or veteran 17 of the United States marine corps may make application for such 18 distinctive license plates, not less than 60 days prior to such person's 19 renewal of registration date, on a form prescribed and furnished by the 20 director of vehicles, and any applicant for the distinctive license plates 21 shall furnish the director with proof as the director shall require that the 22 applicant is a retired member current member or veteran of the United 23 States marine corps. Application for the registration of a passenger vehicle, 24 truck or motorcycle and issuance of the license plates under this section 25 shall be made by the owner or lessee in a manner prescribed by the 26 director of vehicles upon forms furnished by the director.

(c) No registration or distinctive license plate issued under theauthority of this section shall be transferable to any other person.

(d) Renewals of registration under this section shall be made 29 30 annually, upon payment of the fee prescribed in subsection (a), in the 31 manner prescribed in K.S.A. 8-132(b), and amendments thereto. No 32 renewal of registration shall be made to any applicant until such applicant 33 has filed with the director a form as provided in subsection (b). If such 34 form is not filed, the applicant shall be required to comply with K.S.A. 8-143, and amendments thereto, and return the distinctive license plates to 35 36 the county treasurer of such person's residence.

New Sec. 4. (a) On and after January 1, 2020, any owner or lessee of one or more passenger vehicles, trucks of a gross weight of 20,000 pounds or less or motorcycles, who is a resident of Kansas, and who submits satisfactory proof to the director of vehicles, in accordance with rules and regulations adopted by the secretary of revenue, that such person is-a retired member of the United States air force currently serving in the United States air force or has separated from the United States air 1 force and was honorably discharged or received a general discharge

2 under honorable conditions, upon compliance with the provisions of this 3 section, may be issued one distinctive license plate for each such 4 passenger vehicle, truck or motorcycle designating such person as a retired 5 member current member or veteran of the United States air force. Such 6 license plates shall be issued for the same period of time as other license 7 plates upon proper registration and payment of the regular license fee as 8 provided in K.S.A. 8-143, and amendments thereto.

9 (b) Any person who is a retired member current member or veteran 10 of the United States air force may make application for such distinctive license plates, not less than 60 days prior to such person's renewal of 11 12 registration date, on a form prescribed and furnished by the director of 13 vehicles, and any applicant for the distinctive license plates shall furnish the director with proof as the director shall require that the applicant is a 14 retired member current member or veteran of the United States air force. 15 16 Application for the registration of a passenger vehicle, truck or motorcycle 17 and issuance of the license plates under this section shall be made by the 18 owner or lessee in a manner prescribed by the director of vehicles upon 19 forms furnished by the director.

20 (c) No registration or distinctive license plate issued under the 21 authority of this section shall be transferable to any other person.

22 (d) Renewals of registration under this section shall be made 23 annually, upon payment of the fee prescribed in subsection (a), in the 24 manner prescribed in K.S.A. 8-132(b), and amendments thereto. No 25 renewal of registration shall be made to any applicant until such applicant has filed with the director a form as provided in subsection (b). If such 26 27 form is not filed, the applicant shall be required to comply with K.S.A. 8-28 143, and amendments thereto, and return the distinctive license plates to 29 the county treasurer of such person's residence.

30 (a) On and after January 1, 2020, any owner or lessee of New Sec. 5. 31 one or more passenger vehicles, trucks of a gross weight of 20,000 pounds or less or motorcycles, who is a resident of Kansas, and who submits 32 33 satisfactory proof to the director of vehicles, in accordance with rules and 34 regulations adopted by the secretary of revenue, that such person is-a-35 retired member of the United States coast guard currently serving in the 36 United States coast guard or has separated from the United States 37 coast guard and was honorably discharged or received a general 38 discharge under honorable conditions, upon compliance with the 39 provisions of this section, may be issued one distinctive license plate for 40 each such passenger vehicle, truck or motorcycle designating such person 41 as a retired member current member or veteran of the United States 42 coast guard. Such license plates shall be issued for the same period of time 43 as other license plates upon proper registration and payment of the regular

1 license fee as provided in K.S.A. 8-143, and amendments thereto.

(b) Any person who is a retired member current member or veteran 2 3 of the United States coast guard may make application for such distinctive 4 license plates, not less than 60 days prior to such person's renewal of 5 registration date, on a form prescribed and furnished by the director of 6 vehicles, and any applicant for the distinctive license plates shall furnish 7 the director with proof as the director shall require that the applicant is a 8 retired member current member or veteran of the United States coast 9 guard. Application for the registration of a passenger vehicle, truck or 10 motorcycle and issuance of the license plates under this section shall be made by the owner or lessee in a manner prescribed by the director of 11 12 vehicles upon forms furnished by the director.

13 (c) No registration or distinctive license plate issued under the 14 authority of this section shall be transferable to any other person.

(d) Renewals of registration under this section shall be made 15 16 annually, upon payment of the fee prescribed in subsection (a), in the 17 manner prescribed in K.S.A. 8-132(b), and amendments thereto. No 18 renewal of registration shall be made to any applicant until such applicant 19 has filed with the director a form as provided in subsection (b). If such 20 form is not filed, the applicant shall be required to comply with K.S.A. 8-21 143, and amendments thereto, and return the distinctive license plates to 22 the county treasurer of such person's residence.

Sec. 6. K.S.A. 2018 Supp. 8-1,141 is hereby amended to read as follows: 8-1,141. (a) Any new distinctive license plate authorized for issuance on and after July 1, 1994, shall be subject to the personalized license plate fee prescribed by K.S.A. 8-132(c), and amendments thereto. This section shall not apply to any distinctive license plate authorized prior to July 1, 1994.

(b) The director of vehicles shall not issue any new distinctive license
plate authorized for issuance on and after July 1, 1995, unless there is a
guarantee of an initial issuance of at least 500 license plates.

(c) The provisions of this section shall not apply to distinctive license
plates issued under the provisions of K.S.A. 8-1,145, or K.S.A. 2018 Supp.
8-177d, 8-1,163, 8-1,166, 8-1,185, 8-1,186, 8-1,187-or-, 8-1,188, section *1, section 2, section 3, section 4 or section 5,* and amendments thereto.

(d) The provisions of subsection (a), shall not apply to distinctive
license plates issued under the provisions of K.S.A. 8-1,146 or 8-1,148,
and amendments thereto, or K.S.A. 2018 Supp. 8-1,153, 8-1,158 or 81,161, and amendments thereto.

40 (e) The provisions of subsection (f) shall not apply to distinctive
41 license plates issued under the provisions of K.S.A. 2018 Supp. 8-1,160
42 and 8-1,183, and amendments thereto, except that the division shall delay
43 the manufacturing and issuance of such distinctive license plate until the

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division has received not less than 1,000 orders for such plate, including
 payment of the personalized license plate fee required under subsection
 (a). Upon certification by the director of vehicles to the director of
 accounts and reports that not less than 1,000 paid orders for such plate
 have been received, the director of accounts and reports shall transfer
 \$40,000 from the state highway fund to the distinctive license plate fund.

(f) (1) Any person or organization sponsoring any distinctive license
plate authorized by the legislature on and after July 1, 2004, shall submit
to the division of vehicles a nonrefundable amount not to exceed \$20,000,
to defray the division's cost for developing such distinctive license plate.

11 (2) All moneys received under this subsection shall be remitted by the 12 secretary of revenue to the state treasurer in accordance with the 13 provisions of K.S.A. 75-4215, and amendments thereto. Upon receipt of 14 each such remittance, the state treasurer shall deposit the entire amount in 15 the state treasury to the credit of the distinctive license plate fund which is 16 hereby created in the state treasury. All moneys credited to the distinctive 17 license plate fund shall be used by the department of revenue only for the 18 purpose associated with the development of distinctive license plates. All expenditures from the distinctive license plate application fee fund shall be 19 20 made in accordance with appropriation acts, upon warrants of the director 21 of accounts and reports issued pursuant to vouchers approved by the 22 secretary of the department of revenue.

(g) (1) Except for educational institution license plates issued under
K.S.A. 8-1,142, and amendments thereto, the director of vehicles shall
discontinue the issuance of any distinctive license plate authorized prior to
July 1, 2004, and which is subject to the provisions of subsection (b) if:

(A) Less than 500 license plates, including annual renewals, areissued for that distinctive license plate by July 1, 2006; and

(B) less than 250 license plates, including annual renewals, are issued
for that distinctive license plate during any subsequent two-year period
after July 1, 2006.

32 (2) The director of vehicles shall discontinue the issuance of any33 distinctive license plate authorized on and after July 1, 2004, if:

34 (A) Less than 500 plates, including annual renewals, are issued for 35 that distinctive license plate by the end of the second year of sales; and

(B) less than 250 license plates, including annual renewals, are issued
 for that distinctive license plate during any subsequent two-year period.

(h) An application for any distinctive license plate issued after
December 31, 2012, and the corresponding royalty fee may be collected
either by the county treasurer or the entity benefiting from the issuance of
the distinctive license plate. Annual royalty payments collected by the
county treasurers shall be remitted to the state treasurer in accordance with
the provisions of K.S.A. 75-4215, and amendments thereto. Upon receipt

1 of each such remittance the state treasurer shall deposit the entire amount 2 in the state treasury to the credit of a segregated royalty fund which shall 3 be administered by the state treasurer. All expenditures from the royalty 4 fund shall be made in accordance with appropriation acts upon warrants of 5 the director of accounts and reports issued pursuant to vouchers approved 6 by the state treasurer or the state treasurer's designee. Payments from the 7 royalty fund shall be made to the entity benefiting from the issuance of the 8 distinctive license plate on a monthly basis.

9 (i) Notwithstanding any other provision of law, for any distinctive 10 license plate, the division shall produce such distinctive license plate for a 11 motorcycle upon request to the division by the organization sponsoring the 12 distinctive license plate.

(j) In addition to any residency requirements for all distinctive license
plates, any person not a resident of Kansas, serving as a member of the
armed forces stationed in this state shall be eligible to apply for any
distinctive license plate as if the individual was a resident of this state.
Such person shall be eligible to renew the distinctive license plate
registration as long as the person is still stationed in this state at the time
the registration is renewed.

20 Sec. 7. K.S.A. 2018 Supp. 8-1,147 is hereby amended to read as 21 follows: 8-1,147. In the event of the death of any person issued distinctive 22 license plates under the provisions of K.S.A. 8-161, 8-177a, 8-177c, 8-23 1,139, 8-1,140, 8-1,145 or 8-1,146 or K.S.A. 2018 Supp. 8-177d, 8-1,163, 24 8-1,166, 8-1,185, 8-1,186, 8-1,187-or, 8-1,188, section 1, section 2, 25 section 3, section 4 or section 5, and amendments thereto, the surviving spouse or other family member, if there is no surviving spouse, shall be 26 27 entitled to possession of any such distinctive license plates. Such license 28 plates shall not be displayed on any vehicle unless otherwise authorized by 29 statute

30 Sec. 8. K.S.A. 2018 Supp. 8-1,141 and 8-1,147 are hereby repealed.
