SUPPLEMENTAL NOTE ON HOUSE BILL NO. 2650

As Recommended by House Committee on
Federal and State Affairs

Brief*

HB 2650 would designate February 15 of each year as Susan B. Anthony Day in Kansas.

The bill would be in effect upon publication in the *Kansas Register*.

Background

The bill was introduced by Representatives Pittman, Arnberger, Croft, French, Gartner, Lynn, Neighbor, Susan Ruiz, Warfield, Wasinger, Weigel, and Xu.

In the House Committee on Federal and State Affairs hearing, Representative Pittman testified in favor of the bill, stating February 15 recognizes the birthday of Susan B. Anthony, who was a national leader in the women's suffrage movement and who also had ties to Kansas.

Written-only proponent testimony was provided by seven private citizens. No other testimony was provided.

The House Committee recommended the bill be placed on the Consent Calendar.

According to the fiscal note prepared by the Division of the Budget on the bill, the Kansas Historical Society indicates enactment of the bill would have no fiscal effect on agency operations.
