RE: House Bill 2006

HB 2006 would amend K.S.A. 35-107 and 35-205 concerning the designation of state holidays. Under current law, the second Monday in October is recognized as Columbus Day. The bill would change this day to be recognized as Indigenous Peoples Day. Additionally, under current law, the fourth Saturday in September is designated as Native American Day. The bill would eliminate that designation and keep the first Wednesday in February as "Native American Legislative Day at the Capitol".
