I am speaking in support of Senate Bill 479. Our work began with the 100th plus years celebration of the passage of voting rights for women. Kansas has been at the forefront of recognizing women and men have equal rights. Kansas passed legislation granting the right to vote in 1912; eight years before the 19th Amendment to the Constitution.
