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## COMPARISON OF HOUSE BILL 2048 AND SENATE BILL 14 – ENACTING THE GOVERNMENTAL RESPONSE TO THE COVID-19 PANDEMIC IN KANSAS

This memorandum provides a brief comparison of current law and two similar bills introduced in the 2021 Session, House Bill 2048 and Senate Bill 14.

The Governor may issue orders pursuant to this section, but within 24 hours of the issuance of any such order, shall call a meeting of the State Finance Council to review such order.

The Governor shall not have the power or authority to temporarily or permanently seize, or authorize seizure of, any ammunition or to suspend or limit the sale, dispensing or transportation of firearms or ammunition.

The Governor shall not have the power or authority to alter or modify any provisions of the election laws of the state, including method or timing.

Counties may adopt orders relating to public health that are less stringent than statewide executive orders.
