Kansas Highway Patrol Staffing:

Current Staffing:

Sworn/Uniformed Members (Troopers & LEO): 469

- □ 424 Troopers (Trooper Colonel)
- 29 Full-Time Law Enforcement Officers
- 16 Motor Carrier Inspectors

Civilian Staff (Non-Sworn):

267

TOTAL 736



Kansas Highway Patrol Staffing:

Sworn/Uniformed Members:	547	517	485	469
Civilian Staff (Non-Sworn):	283	290	271	267

- Down 78 sworn members since 2019
- Down 16 civilian members since 2019



Challenges with Recruitment and Retention:

- Same recruitment challenges as the private and public sector
- Other State Patrol, State Police and LE agencies experiencing similar issues
 - EX: Iowa State Patrol down nearly 100 Troopers and experiencing small recruit class sizes
 - Midwest State Patrol agency implementing a \$5k sign on bonus and \$7,500 relocation fee to attract applicants
 - Nebraska and Missouri looking at adopting something similar
 - Ohio State Patrol is experiencing similar issues (low staffing, employees transferring to larger agencies w/more pay, etc.)
 - This is just some of what we are hearing when we meet and/or talk with other State Patrol agencies



Challenges with Recruitment and Retention:

- Economy (somethings got to give)
- COVID (many want to work from home)
- Appears current workforce is diminishing
- We hire to a higher standard
- Anti-police and defund the police movement
- Negative news media
- Dangers associated with police work
- Salary and wages (competition with other LEO agencies)



Vulnerabilities associated with reduced staffing:

- Slower response times
- Less timely in assisting local partners and agencies when requested
- Less than optimal Troopers/Officers on the roads (reduced visibility)
- Must rely on other resources for additional coverage
- Officer safety concerns in some instances
- Burnout/Retention challenges



- KHP experienced increase in applicants with implementation of CPP in 2016
- Recent pay increases (Exec. Directive #22-548 & 22-553)
- Have experienced a slight increase in applicants since pay increase became effective

- > CPP & DROP (many have participated in DROP)
 - > DROP has proven to be invaluable during this national labor shortage
- VIN, Port, CAG & 999 Part-Time LEO pay increases
- Modified hiring process for Trooper:
 - On-line personality-based test (Wonderlic)
 - Measures cognitive abilities and motivational traits
 - Leaner and quicker hiring process
 - Command staff reviews background investigations on a more frequent basis
 - Able to extend conditional offer much sooner



- Accredited through CALEA Recruitment Plan for Communications and sworn positions (look at demographics, etc.)
- Recruiter, Public Resource Officers and Adjunct Recruiters (stay in contact with applicants)
- Career Fairs & CJ Programs





P&GA Unit offices out of KHP Headquarters (7th and Jackson)

Three (3) Lieutenants:

- One (1) Legislative Liaison Lieutenant
- One (1) State Public Information Officer Lieutenant
- One (1) Recruiter Lieutenant

NOTE:

- P&GA personnel serve as legislative liaisons for the Patrol
- Provide coverage for both the House and Senate Chambers
- Assist with security operations for Statehouse



Capitol Police Staffing:

Captain Amber Harrington (Capitol Police - Troop K Commander)

Capitol Police HQ located in DSOB with offices in Statehouse

Five (5) Lieutenants:

- One (1) Administrative Lieutenant
- Two (2) Field Lieutenants (Street/Building Patrol)
- One (1) Statehouse Lieutenant
- One (1) Lieutenant over Part-Time LEO Ops.

Seventeen (17) Full-Time Law Enforcement Officers (LEO):

- Eleven (11) assigned to Capitol Complex patrol
- Two (2) assigned to Cedar Crest
- Four (4) assigned to Statehouse

TOTAL: Twenty-Three (23) Full-Time Officers (Including CAPT)



Capitol Police Staffing:

Twelve (12) Part-Time Law Enforcement Officers (Suit & Tie)

Statehouse, Insurance, Judicial Center & Memorial Hall

Sixteen (16) Capitol Area Guards (CAG)

 Statehouse, CSOB, LSOB, ESOB, Scott Building, Mills Building, and Central Monitoring

Four (4) Communication Specialists

Two (2) Clerical Staff

TOTAL: Fifty-Seven (57) Employees



Capitol Police Recruitment & Retention:

- Only one (1) full-time LEO vacancy
- Hoping to see more applicants with recent pay increases (Exec. Directive #22-548 & 22-553)

➤ Law Enforcement Officer I \$19.65 (0-3 years)

Current Hourly rate:

Law Enforcement Officer I

\$27.61 (0-3 years)



Capitol Police Recruitment & Retention:

- Currently eight (8) Part-Time LEO's down (Down 5 from 2019)
- Currently five (5) CAG's down (Down 5 from 2019)
- New pay increases in 2022 for CAG and 999 LEO (Exec. Directive #22-552)
- Hoping to see more applicants with recent pay increase (experienced substantial increase in applicants for VIN)

999 Part-Time LEO	\$19.16

GUARD & PROTECT JOIN OUR TEAM AS A KHP CAPITOL AREA GUARD



Capitol Police Central Monitoring:

Capitol Area Guards currently monitor 273 cameras:

- Pan/tilt/zoom (PTZ) and fixed
- 109 cameras assigned to the Statehouse (86 interior / 23 Exterior)

Guards also monitor CCure and Simplex Fire Alarm Systems for the Complex:

- 637 doors and 489 panic alarms/buttons
- System sends alerts when a door is forced open, held open too long, or if a panic alarm is pushed
- Department of Facilities handles field repairs in State buildings



Central Monitoring (DSOB)





Statehouse Monitoring:

- Monitoring station located in Visitor's Center (back-up for Central Monitoring)
- Statehouse alarm panel (as shown on the right) allows Officers to broadcast automated alerts/warnings for fire, active shooter and emergency type situations







Statehouse Security:

Five (5) Full-Time Law Enforcement Officers (Including LT) Five (5) Part-Time Officers Three (3) Capitol Area Guards and Central Monitoring (24/7 Coverage)

- Coverage during evening hours during Session
- Street officers being utilized
- Capitol Police conducts security screening checks for Statehouse







Statehouse Security:

Screening equipment for Statehouse:

- Two (2) Astrophysics x-ray machines for the Visitor Center
- Two (2) metal detectors for the Visitor Center
- One (1) large Astrophysics x-ray machine for the loading dock





Statehouse Security:

- Security screening primarily serves to deter criminal activity and is used to identify and intercept unlawful firearms, weapons, explosives and contraband from entering the Statehouse
- Allows officers to monitor and screen visitors
- Officers are required to adhere to all federal and state laws pertaining to concealed carry and the performance of I.D. checks



Protest & Demonstrations:

- Critical Incident Response Policy & Manual
 - Used for special events planning and coordination for large scale events
 - National Incident Management System (NIMS)
 - Incident Command System (ICS)
- Operations Plans established for large scale rallies, protests, etc.
- Troop Commanders develop response plans in cooperation with local authorities for events of potential concern
 - Coordinate communications services;
 - Facilities;
 - Medical services;
 - Specialized teams and functional support;
 - Personnel, equipment, supplies, etc.



Protest & Demonstrations:

- KHP participates in State exercises and training
- Mobile Field Force Deployment
 - A contingent of Troopers specifically trained and equipped in mobile field force tactics.
 - May be activated to be staged and/or deployed by the Superintendent for civil disturbances, or any high profile/high security event with credible intelligence/high probability for civil unrest.



Docking State Office Building Renovation - Impacts on Capitol Police:

- Central Monitoring and Dispatch temporarily relocated to LSOB
- Recommend Capitol Police return to DSOB following completion of project
- Inadequate parking at LSOB
- Not enough space for all of Troop K personnel/operations
 - Need office for CAPT, Admin LT, support staff, etc.
- Slower response times from 7th floor
- Tunnel access eliminated



Docking State Office Building Renovation - Impacts on Capitol Police:

- Lose view of South Apron
- Dispatch and Central Monitoring should not be separated... used as part of Command Post for large events
- If DSOB renovations occur, and to meet the recommendations of Burns & McDonnell, we would likely need approximately 6 additional CAG positions.
- CAG annual salary is approximately \$40k
