Draft Recommendations to the Kansas Legislature from the 2022 Special Committee on Intellectual and Developmental Disability (I/DD) Waiver Modernization (Special Committee)

In consideration of the development of a "Community Support" Home and Community Based Services (HCBS) waiver to serve individuals with I/DD needing fewer services and supports than those provided on the existing Comprehensive I/DD waiver, the Special Committee made the following recommendations:

- 1. The Kansas Department for Aging and Disability Services (KDADS) should provide a fiscal note for each service discussed by the Special Committee for possible inclusion in the Community Support waiver. These services include:
 - a. Transportation;
 - b. Supported employment;
 - c. Individual directed goods and services;
 - d. Personal care;
 - e. Respite;
 - f. Therapy (including Behavioral Support);
 - g. Assistive technology;
 - h. Independent living or community engagement skills;
 - Family/caregiver support and training;
 - j. Financial management services and support brokers; and
 - k. Benefits counseling.
- 2. The Community Support waiver should include the service of "individual directed goods and services" with an annual individual cap of \$20,000.
- 3. The Special Committee supports the transition of the Medicaid managed care system from the 1115 waiver to the 1915(b) waiver.
- 4. KDADS and the Kansas Department of Health and Environment (KDHE) should continue to study strengths-based assessments, such as the Supports Intensity Scale (SIS) or the Medicaid Functional Eligibility Instrument (MFEI), as alternatives to the deficit-based BASIS assessment tool for HCBS I/DD waivers.
- 5. The Community Support waiver should include "individual budget authority" across all services.
- 6. KDADS and KDHE should identify a process to prevent individuals being removed from the autism proposed recipient list without notification.
