Re: Senate Bill 493

The Kansas Organization of Recyclers (KOR), the only statewide recycling and waste reduction association in Kansas, is opposed to Senate Bill 493.

Our concerns regarding SB 493 relate to limiting our local governments from creating their own solutions for reduction and recycling of plastics and other containers designed for the consumption, transportation or protection of merchandise, food or beverages. Communities have a number of reasons to ban or regulate plastics, such as the desire to mitigate litter's effects on ecosystems or wildlife, improve public health or reduce toxins.
