## RE: Proponent Testimony for HB 2238

We want to thank Chairwoman McGinn and the Committee members for allowing the League of Kansas Municipalities the opportunity to provide testimony in support of HB 2238.

The League was approached by a member city in December of 2020 regarding K.S.A. 12-1252 which limits to $\$ 500,000$ the amount an individual donor can give to a city for the purpose of constructing a library. This limit was placed in statute in 1968. In 2021 dollars, $\$ 500,000$ would be the equivalent of $\$ 3,841,799$ in $1968 .{ }^{1}$ In investigating why this limit exists in statute, we were unable to find a public purpose for the limitation. The statutory limitation on donations for libraries has never been updated or indexed.

If an individual donor believes strongly in investing in the community by making a donation to a city, there should not be an artificial limit in statute prohibiting that worthwhile endeavor.

This bill passed the House 124-0.
For these reasons, the League strongly supports HB 2238 and asks this Committee recommend it be passed out favorably for passage to the full Senate for its consideration.
